Dear Mr. Speaker: As the author of Assembly Bill 1661, the principal local government finance trailer bill to the 1999–2000 State Budget, I wish to clarify a technical drafting error so as to avoid any confusion in implementing that new statute.

Section 7 of the bill is an uncodified provision to allocate funds to counties, cities, and special districts in proportion to their 1998–99 losses to the Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund. Subparagraph (A) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) contains a cross-reference to “subdivision (d).” There is no “subdivision (d)” in Section 7. That inadvertent typographical error should have read “subdivision (c).” Similarly, subparagraph (b) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) also references the same “subdivision (d)” and, once again, that should have read “subdivision (c).”

Within the context of Section 7, it becomes obvious that the allocation procedures are in subdivision (c) and not the nonexistent subdivision (d).

To avoid confusion, I request that my explanation be printed in the Assembly Daily Journal so that state and local officials may clearly understand our intent.
