Members of the Assembly: As required by the California Welfare and Institutions Code, Section 19640.5, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning its fiscal audit of the Department of Rehabilitation's (department) Business Enterprises Program for the Blind (program).

This report concludes that the financial condition of the program is sound, however, the program has not reached its potential. Specifically, the department could improve its fiscal management of the program by developing a comprehensive business plan that shows whether its proposed uses for its fund surplus are appropriate and feasible. Additionally, the department can do more to pursue the vending machine commissions that it is mandated to collect. For example, it could establish vending machines at additional state and federal locations and could more actively pursue commissions from vending machine operators or agencies that have failed to remit these commissions.

#### Robert Tharratt

WHEREAS, I am delighted to honor and congratulate Mr. Robert Tharratt for his long-awaited recognition as a recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross, one of the Air Force's highest honors, for his bravery and extraordinary efforts during World War II; and

WHEREAS, during a critical time in the history of the United States and the world, Mr. Tharratt joined the many young, patriotic individuals of the time and enlisted to proudly serve his country and fight a war that was dividing nations and bringing much destruction to the globe; and

WHEREAS, although peril and insecurity abounded in the United States due to World War II, many enthusiastic, prospective heroes, including Mr. Tharratt, were eager to join the forces to ensure the freedom and opportunity that has long existed in America; and

WHEREAS, in respect to the intensive training he acquired in the military, Mr. Tharratt was able to react instantaneously and assist Mr. Billy Lowery when dire circumstances arose, putting the life and needs of his companion ahead of his own interests and making sure that they made it safely out of the aircraft; and

WHEREAS, although they were captured by Germans upon landing on the ground and kept as prisoners of war for nine months, Mr. Tharratt and his companions were able to endure the time away from their homeland, while held in captivity, and keep hope that they would make it back safely and be celebrated and recognized for their service and bravery, as they are today; now, therefore be it

*RESOLVED*, That I, Cruz M. Bustamante, Acting Governor of the State of California, do hereby honor and recognize Mr. Robert Tharratt for his outstanding and enthusiastic efforts and bravery and encourage all Californians to join me in doing so.

### CONSIDERATION OF DAILY FILE SECOND READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS
