RE: Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Bargaining Units 2 (Attorneys and Hearing Officers), 7 (Protective Services and Public Safety), 13 (Stationary Engineers), 18 (Psychiatric Technicians), and 19 (Health and Social Services Professionals)

The California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) has reached a new Tentative Agreement/MOU with the unions representing Bargaining Unit (BU) 2, California Attorneys, Administrative Law Judges, and Hearing Officers in State Employment, and BU 13, International Union of Operating Engineers. Upon approval by the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by employee membership, the BU 2 agreement will be effective July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2028, and the BU 13 agreement will be effective July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2027. In accordance with Government Code Sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, please accept the attached Tentative Agreement/MOU legislative and fiscal summaries.

CalHR has also reached MOU Addenda (Side Letter) agreements with BU 7, California Statewide Law Enforcement Association, BU 18, California Association of Psychiatric Technicians, and BU 19, American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees. These Tentative Agreements/MOUs and Side Letters, among other things, address the budget shortfall by implementing the Personal Leave Program (PLP 2025), effective July 1, 2025, through July 1, 2027, and/or reflect Other Post Employment Benefit Prefunding changes through June 30, 2027.

The Tentative Agreements/MOUs and Side Letters include savings measures that contribute to meeting the budgeted reductions in Section 3.90 of the 2025 Budget Act as amended by Assembly Bill 102 or Senate Bill 102. These successor MOUs and MOU addenda are deemed ratified by the State effective July 1, 2025, and represent employee compensation savings of \$113.6 million (\$60.0 million General Fund) in fiscal year 2025–26 and \$53.3 million (\$40.7 million General Fund) in fiscal year 2026–27.

Pursuant to Provision 12 of Items 9800-001-0001, 9800-001-0494, and 9800-001-0988 of the 2025 Budget Act, on behalf of the Department of Finance, the following items are being adjusted for the savings totaling \$113,613,000 as a result of the successor MOUs and Side Letters:

- Item 9800-001-0001 is being decreased by \$60,020,000.
- Item 9800-001-0494 is being decreased by \$35,907,000.
- Item 9800-001-0988 is being decreased by \$17,686,000.

The Tentative Agreement/MOU provisions also carry forward language from previous agreements and make various other recruitment, retention, and labor changes.
