The Speaker pro Tempore ruled the point of order not well taken; that it is his opinion that Senate Bill No. 75 meets the criteria set forth in Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(1); anticipated revenues to the State would include balances carried forward in the current fiscal year into the upcoming fiscal year, and when that is added to the revenues set forth in the Budget Act, the Legislature would be sending a balanced Budget to the Governor.

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member Richman arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2) states that no Budget Bill may be voted upon on the floor of the Assembly unless it provides for a General Fund reserve of not less than 3 percent of the total of all General Fund appropriations made in the Budget Bill for the fiscal year, or provides for a reserve of not less than 1 percent and a specific plan to phase in a reserve of at least 3 percent within three years. Is such a reserve contained in this Budget Bill?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore Keeley

Speaker pro Tempore Keeley replied that Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2) further states that the percentage of General Fund reserve shall be calculated by dividing the reserve of the General Fund by estimated revenues of the General Fund for the fiscal year. The proposed Conference Committee Report on Senate Bill No. 75 estimates General Fund revenues at \$75.158 billion and that amount multiplied by 3 percent is the determination as to whether the criteria set forth in Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2) are met. The reserve contained in the Conference Committee Report on Senate Bill No. 75 is \$2.2 billion plus a \$100 million litigation reserve for a total of \$2.3 billion and it is therefore the opinion of the Chair that the criteria set forth in the Assembly Rules are met.

Point of Order

Assembly Member Richman arose to the following point of order:

The reserve in the Budget would need to be \$2.27 billion to meet the criteria set forth in Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2) and it is his opinion that this Budget does not contain a reserve for litigation.

Ruling by Speaker pro Tempore Keeley

The Speaker pro Tempore ruled that the proposed Conference Committee Report on Senate Bill No. 75 contains the following reserves: \$701 million liquidation of encumbrances; \$100 million set aside for legal contingencies; \$2.203 billion estimated economic uncertainties. Therefore a 3 percent reserve is constituted meeting the criteria of Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2).

Assembly Member Strickland seconded the motion.
