Dear Senator Steinberg, Speaker Bass, Senator Hollingsworth and Mr. Blakeslee,

Earlier today, I declared a fiscal emergency and called for the Legislature to convene in special session under Proposition 58 to address our budget deficit. I took this action after the Legislature failed to pass a revised budget for fiscal year 2009–10 to effectively address our state's unprecedented fiscal crisis.

Fixing our budget deficit—in its entirety—is the most important and pressing issue we, as leaders of the state, have before us at this time. Therefore, I will veto any bills that reach my desk before I have signed a revised budget that fully solves our deficit. I will only make exceptions for bills that are urgent or necessary, such as those extending an imminent sunset date or impacting the state's ability to secure federal funding.

Currently, there are 32 bills that have passed the Legislature and been sent to me for my consideration. I will consider each of these bills on their individual merits but will veto any additional measures that do not fall under the aforementioned exemptions.
