**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bill was introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 79—La Suer (Principal coauthor: Bogh) (Coauthors: Ashburn, Bates, Briggs, Bill Campbell, John Campbell, Cogdill, Cox, Daucher, Dickerson, Hollingsworth, Kelley, Leach, Leonard, Leslie, Maddox, Mountjoy, Robert Pacheco, Rod Pacheco, Pescetti, Richman, Runner, Strickland, Wyland, Wyman, and Zettel). An act to amend Sections 65922, 65928, 65930, and 65943.5 of the Government Code, to amend Section 42301.14 of the Health and Safety Code, and to amend Sections 21080, 25506, 25541.5, 25550, and 25552 of, and to add Sections 25135.5, 25214.5, 25513.5, and 25519.5 to, the Public Resources Code, relating to energy resources, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
