Legislative Intent—Senate Bill No. 1493

July 7, 1998

The Honorable Antonio R. Villaraigosa Speaker of the Assembly Room 219, State Capitol Sacramento, California

Dear Mr. Speaker: As the author of Senate Bill 1493, this is to set forth the intent of the legislation.

SB 1493 allows a surviving corporation, which results from a merger or acquisition that does not involve a change of ownership, to succeed to all licenses, permits, registrations and other privileges granted by and local government agency without payment of any fee for such succession. Mergers not involving a change of ownership are defined in the bill as mergers between (1) a corporation and its wholly owned subsidiary; (2) a corporation and the wholly owned subsidiary of that corporation's wholly owned subsidiary; or (3) two wholly owned subsidiaries of the same parent corporation.

The purpose is to prevent the charging of fees for licenses, permits, registrations, etc., already obtained validly by essentially the same business enterprise. In such transactions, the operations of the business usually continue as before the merger and usually are carried out by the same personnel with little outward appearance of change except for the business name. Under these circumstances requiring additional fees is neither fair nor equitable and serve to impose an unnecessary cost on a fully legal and appropriate internal reorganization.

Safeguards are provided in the bill to allow tax assessors to reassess real property upon transfer of title and to allow local agencies to reevaluate privileges previously granted a disappearing corporation if deemed by the affected local agencies as necessary "to public health, safety, or welfare purposes."
