#### MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

The following veto message from the Governor was received and ordered printed in the Journal and the bill ordered to the unfinished business file:

#### Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 799

Governor's Office, Sacramento July 7, 2003

To Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 799 without my signature.

This bill allows the Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) to conduct an initial competitive bid process to select a provider for the Linkages and Alzheimer's Day Care Resource Center (ADCRC) programs. After this initial process, this bill allows the AAAs to continue contracting with the same service provider without conducting another competitive bid process unless the AAA determines it is in the best interest of the State to do so.

While I sympathize with the goals of the bill, it is inconsistent with Executive Order D-02-55, which I signed on May 20, 2002 that requires open and competitive bidding be used to the greatest extent possible in awarding state contracts. In addition, state policy mirrors federal requirements by mandating open and free competition. Open and competitive bidding ensures that state agencies and California taxpayers receive the best value for the goods and services purchased, and that all eligible providers have equal access and opportunity to provide these goods and services. The California Code of Regulations requires AAAs to obtain goods and services through open and competitive awards at least once every four years. This requirement is very reasonable and should be retained.

For these reasons, I am returning the bill.
