RE: Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding for Bargaining Unit 16 (Physicians, Dentists, and Podiatrists) and Tentative Agreement/Addenda for Bargaining Unit 10 (Professional Scientists)

The California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) has reached a new Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the union representing Bargaining Unit (BU) 16, represented by the Union of American Physicians and Dentists (UAPD), and a new Tentative Agreement/Side Letter with BU 10, represented by the California Association of Professional Scientists (CAPS). Upon approval by the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by employee membership, the BU 16 agreement will be effective from July 1, 2025, through July 1, 2028, and the BU 10 Side Letter will be effective from July 1, 2025, through July 1, 2028. In accordance with Government Code Sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, please accept the attached Tentative Agreement/MOU and Side Letter, legislative and fiscal summaries. The BU 16 Tentative Agreement/MOU addresses the budget shortfall by implementing the Personal Leave Program (PLP 2025). Effective the first day of the pay period following ratification by both parties, BU 16-represented employees will be subject to PLP 2025 for at least 16 months. Additionally, beginning the first day of the pay period following ratification by both parties, and ending June 30, 2027, the monthly contribution for prefunding other post-employment benefits (OPEB) is suspended and shall not be withheld from employees' salaries or contributed by the employer. These savings measures contribute to meeting the budgeted reductions in Section 3.90 of the 2025 Budget Act as amended by Assembly Bill 102 (Gabriel, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2025). The provisions also carry forward language from the current MOU and make various other recruitment, retention, and labor changes.

The BU 10 Tentative Agreement/Side Letter is effective immediately and suspends the return to office Executive Order N-22-25 for employees represented by BU 10 and reinstitutes it on July 1, 2026. Because there are no costs associated with this provision, there is no fiscal summary attached.
