John Jerome Norton, 61, a San Francisco native son, passed away Thursday, July 9, after a long battle with cancer at his San Mateo home, which he shared with his loving wife, Lynne.

Norton began his career in the United States Marine Corps at age 17. Sigma Chi President, and Varsity blackbelt in Judo, Norton received his commission as Second Lieutenant upon graduation from San Jose State University in 1959. Following college, Norton became a patrolman with the San Francisco Police Department. Norton then took military leave for a tour of duty in the Mediterranean aboard the flagship USS Little Rock.

In 1962, Norton joined the Federal Bureau of Investigation. During his career as a Special Agent, Norton received numerous commendations from J. Edgar Hoover for his work in the investigation and capture of bank robbers.

Norton took a leave of absence from the FBI in 1967 and volunteered for duty in Vietnam as an infantry captain. During his one and a half tours, Norton was wounded three times and was awarded the Navy Cross, the nation's second highest military award for heroism in combat. Norton also received the Navy Commendation with Gold Star, two Bronze Star Medals with Gold Star, two Purple Hearts and numerous other combat citations. Colonel Norton retired from the United States Marine Corps in 1996.

In 1971, Norton was appointed Chief of Public Safety, Foster City, California where he served twelve years. Norton accepted the governor's appointment as Chief of Police, California State Police in 1983. During his tenure as a police chief, Norton served as President of the International Association of Chiefs of Police and President of the California Police Chiefs' Association. Norton completed his distinguished career in law enforcement while serving with the United States Department of Justice as the United States Attorney General's Liaison Officer, San Francisco Region. During this time, he was seriously injured in an automobile accident while at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

Although ill, Norton completed his term as President of the San Mateo Rotary in June 1998. During his presidency, Norton was honored as a Paul Harris Fellow by Rotary International Foundation.

Norton's proud Irish legacy will be carried on by his three sons, Timothy, Stephen and Michael and daughters Caitlin, Meghan and Connie. Norton looked forward to the birth of his first two grandchildren later this year. Norton is also survived by his mother Janet Norton, brother Tom Norton, sister Shela Norton Greenlaw, and step-daughters Debbie Emery, Christina Cline, and grand-daughter Alexa Krantz.
