To Members of the Assembly:

I am signing Assembly Bill No. 1104 because it establishes the framework for improvements to various water quality programs. However, the bill does not reflect a consensus among the discharger, agricultural, industrial and environmental interests.

Despite its flaws, I am signing AB 1104, immediately followed by my signing SB 709. SB 709 addresses concerns raised over AB 1104 by providing flexibility to regulatory agencies to target Pollution Prevention Plans to only those contaminants posing a threat to water quality and providing clarification to the minimum penalty provisions. Combined, AB 1104 and SB 709 provide a consensus approach to this significant environmental program.

To Members of the Assembly:

I am signing Assembly Bill No. 1660 with the following message.

I intend to make every effort to ensure that all persons living in California are counted in the 2000 census. While I do not oppose the creation of a California Complete Count Committee (CCCC), the provisions of this bill are too restrictive for a proposal whose goal is to account for *all* persons living in this state. Specifically, the requisite criteria for gubernatorial appointees under this bill could have the unintended consequence of denying undercounted groups representation on the CCCC. Two of the gubernatorial appointments

outlined in this bill are effectively restricted to individuals in Los Angeles County. To limit the CCCC membership in this manner would be shortsighted and unfair to those whom the bill purports to champion.

Additionally, since this bill would not become effective until January 1, 2000, it is unlikely that a plan could be implemented to maximize the participation of California residents in the 2000 federal decennial census by the timelines specified in the bill. This bill would require the CCCC to implement the plan no later than February 15, 2000, and to continue implementation through September 1, 2000. Outreach activities, in order to be effective, would ideally commence long before the effective date of this bill. Moreover, the United States Census Bureau generally terminates public outreach activities after June 30, 2000, because those activities could interfere with the Bureau's accuracy and coverage evaluation survey used to adjust the census undercount.

It is my expectation, in signing this measure, that the CCCC provisions are proposed to be repealed in SB 711, thereby removing the restrictions on my ability to appoint appropriate members to the CCCC and the untenable timelines. Because I agree with the concept of this bill, I plan to establish, through executive order, a method by which an aggressive outreach program aimed at ensuring the complete count of all Californians can be undertaken within prudent time frames and with inclusive representation.

To Members of the Assembly:

I am signing Assembly Bill No. 1661.

This local government budget trailer bill, an urgency measure, specifies restrictions on the use of resources in the State Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank and establishes reporting requirements. In addition, it provides the mechanism for the allocation of a one-time \$150 million General Fund subvention to local agencies in the fiscal year 1999–00.

I am concerned about the provisions of this bill that would enact, contingent upon the passage of a constitutional amendment, capping the Education Revenue Augmentation Fund and requiring the State to provide specific property tax administration subventions to counties. Although I concur with the need to address the state-local fiscal relationship, AB 1661 presupposes that capping the ERAF and state assumption of certain property tax administration costs incurred by counties are appropriate solutions to reforming state and local government finance. I believe sustainable state and local government finance reform must be approached more broadly and comprehensively and not be restricted to examination of the property tax only. Furthermore, capping the ERAF value at the 1999–00 level would ignore the various measures that have already mitigated the impact of

the property tax shift. For some counties, the value of these mitigation measures exceeds the current value of their property tax shifts.

I support the technical amendments proposed in Senate Bill 711, which would clarify the provisions concerning the allocation of the \$150 million subvention in the 1999–00 fiscal year.

To Members of the Assembly:

I am signing Assembly Bill No. 1682 with the understanding that Senate Bill No 710 will be enacted to delete the provisions contained in Sections 4 and 5 of AB 1682 which provides a 100 percent state share-of-cost above a capped county share-of cost for In-Home supportive Services (IHSS) provider wages above the minimum wage negotiated by public authorities. SB 710 instead would provide an 80 percent State share-of-cost for up to a 50 cent wage increase above minimum wage for providers in public authority counties for 1999–00 only.

I expect the State's participation in any future increase to return to the 65 percent share currently required for the payment of wages to IHSS providers up to the statewide minimum wage. The state has no role in IHSS provider wage and benefit negotiations and, therefore, would be unable to manage the program costs in which it would share. In addition, capping the county share-of-cost would remove the incentive for counties to contain program costs and result in significant General Fund costs in the future.
