Ruling by Speaker pro Tempore Keeley

The Speaker pro Tempore ruled that the Budget bill before the Body has a \$6.935 billion carryover from fiscal year 2000–01, and contemplates \$75.158 billion revenues, exclusive of the \$6.935 billion carryover. The total of those figures is a total revenue of \$82.091 billion and total expenditures of \$79.159 billion. Therefore, the budget before the Body is balanced, and in compliance with Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(1).

Point of Order

Assembly Member Robert Pacheco arose to the following point of order:

Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2) states that no Budget bill may be voted upon on the floor of the Assembly unless it provides for a General Fund reserve of not less than 3 percent of the total of all General Fund appropriations made in the Budget bill for the fiscal year. The Budget bill before the Body has additional expenditures of \$76 million. The reserve of \$2.3 billion minus \$76 million in additional expenditures leaves a reserve of \$2.225 billion. That is a reserve of 2.8 percent and is therefore not in compliance with the 3 percent reserve requirement.

Ruling by Speaker pro Tempore Keeley

The Speaker pro Tempore ruled that the total General Fund appropriations contained in the Budget bill before the Body are \$57.057 billion. The remaining expenditures are ongoing statutory appropriations of \$18.9 billion and ongoing constitutional appropriations of \$2.7 billion, neither of which are subject to the Budget bill. A 3 percent reserve on this Budget bill is \$1.7 billion. This Budget bill contains \$.7 billion liquidated encumbrances, \$100 million litigation set-aside, and \$2.133 billion for economic uncertainties for a combined total of \$2.934 billion. This represents a 5.1 percent reserve when tested against the requirement in the Rules and therefore, Senate Bill No. 739 is in compliance with the requirements of Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2).

Parliamentary Inquiry

Assembly Member John Campbell arose to the following parliamentary inquiry:

Did the Chair state that the reserve threshold is \$1.7 billion, and if so, \$1.7 billion is 3 percent of what figure?

Reply by Speaker pro Tempore Keeley

The Speaker pro Tempore replied that Assembly Rule 66.7(b)(2) requires that there be a 3 percent reserve of all General Fund appropriations made in the Budget bill for the fiscal year. The total general fund appropriations in the Budget bill total \$57 billion. The remaining expenditures are ongoing statutory and ongoing constitutional appropriations and are not included in the calculation of General Fund appropriations made in the Budget bill. Those expenditures are exclusive of the appropriations made in the Budget bill.

Assembly Member John Campbell arose to the following point of order:
