Governor's Office, Sacramento July 13, 2004

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am signing Assembly Bill 61 in order to stabilize the current fiscal crisis in Compton Community College District (CCCD). This bill will provide needed clarification of the authority of the Board of Governors and the Chancellor of California Community Colleges to intervene and restore financial stability in CCCD.

However, I would note this bill does not adequately define the recovery process for CCCD. In the event that future legislation is necessary to address similar fiscal crises in this or other community college districts, such legislation should include provisions that ensure the following elements are included in the intervention:

- 1) An assessment of what led to the fiscal crisis.
- 2) An action plan for addressing deficiencies in district capacity or processes.
- 3) A process for assessing district progress in correcting deficiencies.
- Benchmarks that indicate the presence of local capacity to manage fiscal duties.

Further, in regards to the fiscal crisis at hand, I would encourage the Board of Governors, the Chancellor and the CCCD to work together to restore their local capacity to manage the district. I call for these parties to incorporate in their work elements of recovery outlined above. Restoring local capacity for CCCD to manage its fiscal affairs is the only viable long-term solution to ensuring proper stewardship of public resources and student access to a quality community college education.

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am signing AB 1939 which establishes the California State Military Museum and Resource Center located in Sacramento, California as the official state military museum because I believe that it is very important to preserve California's storied military heritage. However, I am directing the Military Department to propose legislation in 2005 that would correct two concerns I have with this bill.

First, I believe that there should be no confusion between the lines of authority in the operations of the Military Museum as defined in the Military and Veterans Code and the Government Code. As such, a new bill should be introduced to clarify the status of the Museum under the Government Code. Second, it is my intent that the Adjutant General retains authority for the operations and management of the military museum. This bill and a similar bill from 2002, Senate Bill 1470, as written, imposes various responsibilities on the Military Department, but removes the Adjutant General's authority to ensure that the Museum and any appropriated funding are properly administered.
