ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 9—Thurmond and Nazarian. An act to amend Sections 104420 and 104466 of, and to add Article 4 (commencing with Section 104559) to Chapter 1 of Part 3 of Division 103 of, the Health and Safety Code, relating to tobacco use programs.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 10—Bloom. An act to amend Section 30111 of, and to add Section 7284.8 to, the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to local government.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 11—Nazarian. An act to amend Sections 22973 and 22977.1 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to cigarette and tobacco product licensing.
