Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 1689

Governor's Office, Sacramento

July 17, 1998

To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 1689 without my signature.

This bill would require the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CDF) to prepare and submit a report to the Legislature by January 10, 1999 on the fungus known as pitch canker.

This bill is not necessary. The report required by this bill asks for substantially the same information CDF provided to the Legislature less than one year ago (October 1997) in the report titled "Report by the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection on Efforts to Control the Spread of Pitch Canker and Mitigate or Ameliorate the Damage Caused by the Fungus."
