Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning a proposal calling for a separate San Fernando Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) with authority similar to the Los Angeles Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA). This report concludes that under the proposal, the MTA would hand over a portion of the northern extension of the Metro Red Line, three rail corridors (rights-of-way), and bus operations to the proposed VTA. We estimate that 20 percent of the MTA's sales tax revenue would also transfer to the

VTA in addition to other local, state, and federal revenues. We conclude that shifting 20 percent of the existing debt to the VTA to match the 20 percent of total MTA sales tax revenue it will receive would keep both entities viable and support their ability to issue additional bonds as needed. Our analysis indicates the VTA would have net revenues in fiscal year 1998–99 of \$38.6 million over what it needs for operating expenses and payments of principal and interest on the existing debt.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the South Coast Air Quality Management District (district). This report concludes that the district's current policy requiring only the largest polluters to pay emission fees is inequitable. Also, although the district generally issues permits to construct within the time set out in state law, it issues many permits to operate outside its internally-established timelines and lacks processing timelines for certain permits. Our review of other district responsibilities disclosed that it follows procedures to ensure equal opportunity in contracting and employment. Also, we found the key functions and salaries of the district's legal office to be comparable to those of other districts. Further, the district generally complies with laws and procedures for managing the funding of research, development, and demonstration projects although it could improve its reporting of project results to the public. Finally, the district did not fully comply with guidelines against the stigmatizing or promoting of certain products.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the Los Angeles County (county) courthouse construction program. Our review focused on eight courthouse construction projects the county has yet to complete although it has spent \$79 million on them since 1988. The county deferred six of the project in 1994. This report concludes that, because of poor management, the county spent \$18.6 million planning, designing, and buying land for five projects that have scant chance of being built. In addition, it could have avoided much of this spending had it heeded early warnings of insufficient funding. The county has taken corrective action to address its main problems, but these changes are too recent to evaluate. Finally, if it can sustain current revenue levels, the county now projects it will have sufficient funds to complete one of the deferred projects—the Antelope Valley courthouse.

Unanimous consent was granted that the notices of motions to withdraw Assembly Bill No. 1735 and Senate Bill No. 681 from committee be continued until the next legislative day.
