Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 1666

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 1666 without my signature. This bill is similar to a measure I vetoed last year because it failed to correct the broader inadequacies of California's meal period law and because it interfered with local governments' collective bargaining authority.

As the concerns raised in my prior veto message have not been addressed, I am returning this bill without my signature.

To the Members of the California State Assembly:
