Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully request that this letter be printed in the Assembly Journal for purposes of clarifying the intent of AB 1226 which was signed into law as Chapter 583 on September 29, 1997.

I introduced AB 1226 to provide financial assistance to cities that incorporated after January 1, 1987. These cities, like many others, had reduced population growth during the recession of the early 1990s.

AB 1226 was in no way intended to provide this financial assistance to "no-growth" cities, i.e., those that had adopted an ordinance or resolution, or approved a ballot measure, or are subject to a consent decree or court order, that annually limits the number of housing units that may be constructed within the city.

It was my intent that any city using its political will to limit the number of housing units constructed in the city should be excluded from this legislation.

Dear Mr. Wilson: This letter is intended to clarify the use of the word "primarily" in AB 1739 Section 25143.2, (d)(2)(C)(iii). The word, as used in the context of the bill, is intended to limit this component of the exclusion to the used oil which is removed from equipment and vehicles dedicated to the refinery. This would include on site equipment which is owned or leased by the refinery as well as motor vehicles which are used by the refinery but which may occasionally be driven off the premises.

These provisions are not intended to allow recycling of used oil collected from offsite facilities or vehicles, from other company owned facilities or equipment, employee's personal cars, or bulk shipment of any kind.

In addition, the specific reference to 40 CFR Section 279.22 is not meant to imply that the used oil does not also have to be managed in compliance with any other applicable provisions of Part 279.

MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

The following veto message from the Governor was received and ordered printed in the Journal and the bill ordered to the unfinished business file:

Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 2615

Governor's Office, Sacramento July 27, 1998

To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 2615 without my signature.

This bill would authorize 1937 Act counties to "pre-fund" additional cost of living adjustments for retired beneficiaries.

Current law already authorizes counties to provide annual COLA benefits up to five percent on a discretionary basis, and even allows a banking procedure whereby special COLAs beyond any particular year's inflation rate can be paid.

This bill is identical to AB 3830 which was vetoed in 1994. That veto message is still applicable. This bill would provide automatic COLA increases in periods of high inflation. While I understand that these benefits would be pre-funded, it is unwise to strip local elected officials, who are responsible to taxpayers, of their discretion to decide the amount if any and indeed whether to provide the COLAs in the first place.
