Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1810

July 21, 2004

Chief Clerk of the Assembly State Capitol Sacramento, California

Dr. Mr. Wilson: I write to clarify the intent of AB 1810 as related to financial institutions. Assembly Bill 1810 seeks to protect consumers from ATM fraud by requiring ATM companies who sponsor ATMs to individuals to complete background checks before connecting them to the Electronic Financial Network. While banks and financial institutions are heavily regulated, ATM companies that contract out or sponsor ATMs follow no set regulations. This lack of standards has created an invitation for criminal activity, and reports of fraud and theft are steadily increasing.

It is my intention that any financial institution is exempt from the requirements of this bill. Further, the provision of this bill found in Section 51010 (b) exempt financial institutions, their subsidiaries, affiliates and any person providing ATM services to specified regulated financial institutions from this bill. These entities are already adequately regulated under existing state and federal law. This letter is to clarify that it is not my intent that any definition contained in, or provision found in, this bill be interpreted to apply to an entity that is expressly exempted under Section 51010(b).

AB 1810 is intended to be legislation designed to adopt and enforce the ATM industry's own recommended standards for ATM companies not affiliated with banks and financial institutions.
