Members of the Assembly: As required by Chapter 716, Statutes of 1992, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the processing activity associated with the reimbursement requests for certain prescribed drugs under the California Medical Assistance Program. These requests are known as drug treatment authorization requests (TARs). This report concludes that the Department of Health Services received more drug TARs during the current six-month review period than in earlier periods. Only 76 percent of the requests in the sample we reviewed were fully processed within one workday, as required. However, the drug providers could access the decisions on all but a few of these requests within one workday through the department's Provider Telecommunications Network.

To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 1373 without my signature.

This bill would allow the Managed Risk Medical Insurance Board to designate two Community Provider Plans (CPP) in Los Angeles County for participation in the Healthy Families Program.

The designated Community Provider Plan in Los Angeles County has indicated it has capacity to provide full coverage for all Healthy Families Program eligible children in Los Angeles County. It is premature to pursue changes in the authorizing statute, particularly before the Board has any experience with which to gauge a need for additional CPP capacity in Los Angeles County.
