**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF  
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bill was introduced and read the first time:

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 2—Spitzer and Bermudez.** An act to add Chapter 3.21 (commencing with Section 15819.35) and Chapter 3.22 (commencing with Section 15819.39) to Part 10b of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, to repeal Section 2.5 of Chapter 1416 of the Statutes of 1987, and to amend Item 5225-001-0001 of Chapter 47 of the Statutes of 2006, relating to prisons, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
