ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 6—Benoit. An act to add Sections 7020, 7021, and 7022 to the Penal Code, relating to prison construction, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 7—Dymally. An act to amend Sections 11351, 11353.6, 11369, 11370, 11370.2, 11370.4, 11372, 11372.5, 11470, 11470.4, 11488, 11571.1, 11590, and 11703 of, and to repeal Section 11351.5 of, the Health and Safety Code, and to amend Sections 629.52, 999e, 1174.4, 1203.07, 1203.073, 6243, and 12022 of the Penal Code, relating to controlled substances.
