**PRAYER**

Please join me in a moment of reflection.

As we return to the heat of a typical Sacramento August, I recall a winter vacation my wife, Patti, and I enjoyed at the Sapporo Snow Festival in Hokkaido, Japan. We saw massive blocks of ice transformed into artistic creations. It was amazing. And getting up close and touching the sculptures allowed us to appreciate the detail of the work even more. But as Patti said to me, what placed this festival on her “bucket list” was not just the artistic beauty of the intricate ice carvings. The beauty that she appreciated about the carvings was to be found in their delicate impermanence.

In other words, what made us truly appreciate the incredible ice sculptures was the reality that they would last for only three or four weeks. These ice creations could only be enjoyed for a little while. If they were carved in granite or stone, people would not flock to Sapporo in the freezing cold of winter to admire them. If they were made of plastic or steel, people could go in the comfortable spring or summer to see them. But their beauty would lose significance. It is because they were created from ice and snow that we braved the freezing weather, with thousands of other people, to experience the Yuki Matsuri, the “Snow Festival”. As Patti said, it was the delicate impermanence of the ice sculptures that required us to admire and appreciate them now.

In life, nothing can last forever. When we view our lives with such deep reflection, our Wisdom Eyes open to see again what is truly of value in life. Our lives too, are as beautiful and as delicate as the ice sculptures of a winter festival. At the very most, the life of an ice sculpture can be only one winter long. With Wisdom Eyes truly open, we will cherish each and every moment we are able to be together, with gratitude beyond words.
