Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the California Department of Corrections (Corrections) and its contracts for hospital medical services. This report concludes that overall, Corrections' payments for hospital care services have risen \$59.4 million from fiscal years 1998–99 through 2002–03, and grew at an average rate of 21 percent per year, outpacing the national consumer price index average of 8 percent annual growth for hospital services during this same period. The reasons for this growth can be attributed to the combination of more expensive health care and to Corrections'

increased use of contracted hospital facilities. Our analysis indicates that increases in its inpatient hospital payments are driven primarily by more expensive services, whereas increases in its outpatient hospital payments are driven by increases in both the price of services and number of hospital visits.

Two institutions attributed the increases, among other reasons, to changes in contract terms resulting in hospital inpatient payments that were three times as much as they would have paid previously for the same inpatient stay. Further, partly because Corrections pays some hospitals a percentage of the hospital bill when the bill exceeds a contractual threshold rather than base its payment on hospital cost, Corrections paid some hospitals amounts that were from two to eight times the amounts Medicare would have paid the same hospitals for the same services. One of these hospitals included a hospital operated by the Tenet Healthcare Corporation, for which Corrections paid eight times the amount that Medicare would have paid for the invoices we reviewed.

Similarly, one institution's payments for outpatient services increased significantly primarily because its average payment per emergency room outpatient visit, which are paid at a percentage of the hospital bill without a maximum limit, increased from less than \$950 per visit to more than \$3,300 per visit. Moreover, a second institution could not say why its number of outpatient hospital visits increased from 147 to 630 between fiscal years 1998–99 and 2002–03, in part, because the institution, not unlike other institutions, did not consistently enter into Corrections' computer database codes that would allow it to know the procedures it paid for. Additionally, similar to its inpatient hospital payments, because Corrections typically pays hospitals a percentage of their billed charges for outpatient services, rather than base its payments on hospital costs, it paid on average two and one-half times the amounts Medicare would have paid for the same outpatient services.

REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO PRINT IN JOURNAL

Assembly Member Koretz was granted unanimous consent that the following statement of legislative intent / communication be printed in the Journal:

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 2930

August 10, 2004

Hon. Fabian Nunez Speaker of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 219 Sacramento, California

Dear Mr. Speaker: A question concerning a provision of my bill, AB 2930, relative to Section 3303(i) of the Government Code, has arisen which needs clarification. This code section deals with the Peace Officers Procedural Bill of Rights (POBR).

POBR currently provides protections to peace officers who are being interrogated by management. Among others, these protections include the right to be advised by a union representative if the matter at hand is administrative in nature.

AB 2930 clarifies what information must be disclosed to management by the union representative that has been acquired as a result of this officer-union representative relationship. If the information disclosed to an "employee representative" pertains to criminal activity, *current law* requires disclosure of such criminal

activity if the "employee representative" is a peace officer. However, if the "employee representative" is a civilian, current law does not require such disclosure.

I submit this letter as clarification of AB 2930's intent—and that of the Legislature in enacting this measure, which is as follows:

By adopting AB 2930, the Legislature does not intend, in any way, to change any of the requirements of current law with respect to the disclosure of criminal activity by an "employee representative," regardless of whether the representative is a peace officer or a civilian.

Dear Mr. President and Mr. Speaker: We write to clarify the intent of the Legislature in passing AB 1554 by Assemblymember Rick Keene.

It is our intent to recognize the refinanced emergency apportionment for West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD). AB 2756 by Assemblymember Daucher was signed into law by the Governor on June 21, 2004 (Chapter 52, Statutes of 2004). This measure requires the Department of Finance to approve a refinancing of WCCUSD state loan to the previous year's Pooled Money Investment Account. The district made the request to Finance in July 2004 and therefore is entitled to the 2003–04 PMIA rate which is 1.532%.

This letter serves to clarify that it is the intent of the Legislature to use the 2003–04 PMIA rate of 1.532% in determining how much to reimburse West Contra Costa Unified School District for the purpose of meeting the statutory changes made by AB 1554 (Keene).
