Dear Speaker Wesson: AB 1714 was approved by the Legislature on July 3, 2002, and was signed by the Governor on July 11th.

When drafting the most recent amended version of the bill the word “state” in Section 8314(d) was inadvertently struck and in its place “public” was inserted.

It was not the intent of the bill to broaden the application of subdivision (d) of Section 8314 by providing any additional legal justification for using public funds to disseminate information on statewide or local ballot measures.
