RE: Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Bargaining Unit (BU) 5, the California Association of Highway Patrolmen (CAHP)

Dear Senators Atkins and Grove, and Assembly Members Rendon and Waldron: Recently, the California Department of Human Resources reached a new Tentative Agreement/MOU with the union representing BU 5, CAHP. Upon approval of the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by the membership, this agreement will be effective July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2023.

This agreement will roll over language from past agreements and the attached summary highlights provisions with significant changes. Unit 5 members will continue to be provided annual salary adjustments on July 1 as required by the Unit 5 annual compensation survey per Government Code section 19827. In addition, this agreement will include supplemental pension payments to the Patrol Member Retirement plan.

In accordance with Government Code sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, I am forwarding copies of this Tentative Agreement/ MOU, including legislative and fiscal summaries. The Legislative Analyst will be forwarded a copy for analysis, and the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the Assembly will be forwarded copies to note them as available for review in the Daily Journals.
