Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1485

RE: AB 1485 (Scott) Earthquake Protection: Reservoirs; Chapter 876 of the Statutes of 1997

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am writing to the Assembly Journal to clarify the intent of Assembly Bill 1485, Chapter 876 of the Statutes of 1997, which I authored.

AB 1485 addressed the seismic safety of a reservoir proposed to be built in the City of San Marino by the San Gabriel County Water District. Specifically, AB 1485 was introduced in response to an environmental impact report conducted on the proposed project which found that the project would represent a significant danger to the health and safety of students and faculty at the nearby San Marino High School in the event of a moderate to severe seismic event. AB 1485 required the Department of Water Resources Division of Dam Safety to conduct a seismic safety review of *the proposed project as it was originally designed and submitted for environmental review*.

AB 1485 was a straightforward attempt to arbitrate a dispute between three municipal entities in my district. The City of San Marino and the San Marino Unified School District believed the dam project as originally designed to be unsafe. The San Gabriel County Water District believed the proposed project to be seismically sound. *It was clearly the intent of AB 1485 to require the Department of Water Resources Division of Dam Safety to conduct a seismic safety review of the proposed project as it was originally designed and submitted for environmental review.*

Unfortunately, the intent of AB 1485 was circumvented when the water district submitted a substantially altered set of plans and designs to the Division of Dam Safety following extensive consultation with the geologists and engineers at the division. In fact, the public record unequivocally demonstrates that staff within the Division made numerous substantive recommendations to the Water District prior to the "formal" submittal of their application. In short, the Water District determined through consultation with the Division what changes needed to be made for the project to be approved, and consequently submitted plans that reflected those changes.

Furthermore, it was the intent of AB 1485 that Subsection (c) of Section 1 of AB 1485 apply to any substantive changes made to the original design of the project, which was the subject of the EIR in question and the only concern of the Legislature. Subsection (C) was adopted by amendment in the Senate Agriculture Committee. It was Senator Jim Costa's concern in authoring the amendment that if the City's and the School District's concerns regarding the dam were unfounded, that they should pay for the cost of the seismic review. The substantive changes made by the Water District, such as submerging the dam an additional 10 feet underground, prior to submitting the plans to the Division, in itself is evidence that the concerns of the City and School District were in fact warranted.

Thank you for this opportunity to clarify for the public record the intent of AB 1485 Chapter 876 statutes of 1997.
