Members of the Assembly: The California State Auditor presents this audit report of the State Treasurer's Office statement of securities accountability as of December 31, 2008.

The statement of securities accountability presents the securities owned by or pledged to the State directly, securities under investment agreements, and those securities held for safekeeping. The State Treasurer's Office is responsible for the safekeeping of all securities held in the treasury or other depositories. It is not responsible for securities owned by or pledged to the University of California, or for securities in other depositories owned by or pledged to the Public Employees' Retirement System, the State Teachers' Retirement System, the Legislators' Retirement System, or the Judges' Retirement System. The statement of securities accountability is prepared for purposes of accountability. The dollar amounts represent various values, including the par or face value, the original principal value, or

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the current outstanding principal balance. They do not represent cost or market value and should not be used to determine the value of investments owned by, or pledged to, the State. We found that the statement presents fairly the securities accountability of the State Treasurer's Office as of December 31, 2008.

We conducted this audit to comply with the California Government Code, Section 13299.1.
