To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 182 without my signature.

This bill would authorize cities and counties, in addition to current local posting requirements, to notify the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) of any public meetings regarding the adoption or amendment of certain regulated substances. This bill would expand the mandate on local agencies by requiring them to also notice the repeal of those ordinances. Cal/EPA would then be required, to the extent local agencies voluntarily send that information to the Agency, to post it on the Agency's Internet site.

Existing law requires local agencies to provide public notice within the affected community prior to adopting or amending any such ordinance. In fact, many cities and counties already make this information available on their Internet website. Because this information is readily available to the public, any additional requirements for the State to post that information would be unnecessarily duplicative.
