I am returning AB 2738 without my signature.

The report of the California Performance Review contained a multitude of recommendations for improving financial management systems throughout state government and implementing a long-range financial planning process.

The idea of moving California from a paper-based payment system to an electronic one is certainly meritorious. Since I assume that the State Controller is already planning for such an eventuality, this legislation is not essential. The State Controller's office is already working on initiatives to process payroll and payments to local government electronically. This bill also imposes additional responsibilities on the Controller, the Treasurer, and the Department of Finance without providing a General Fund appropriation.

I look forward to working closely with the State Controller in looking for a comprehensive approach to fiscal management of the State rather than the piecemeal approach this bill takes.

For these reasons, I am unable to sign this measure at this time.

Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 2917

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning AB 2917 without my signature.

Since the days of Governor Hiram Johnson, the initiative, the referendum and the recall have been used by the people of California to dramatically alter the destiny of the state. At the very heart of the initiative process is the 1st Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and the core value of political speech. Any burden placed on either of these fundamental rights of Californians must be examined through a lens that favors the right of the people to address grievances with the government through initiatives, referendums, and recalls.

Current law makes it a misdemeanor to intentionally misrepresent the contents of any state or local initiative, referendum, or recall petition. No one has been prosecuted under this provision since 1994. This bill makes only a slight change to the standard a prosecutor can use to prosecute an individual who makes a false statement or misrepresentation when circulating petitions and subjects them to higher penalties. It is hard to discern whether this bill is intended to address a serious problem with the signature gathering process or to make signature gathering efforts more difficult to thwart the initiative power.

I believe in the power of the people of California and I will continue to take my ideas to them through the initiative process. I will not support any measure that places additional burden on the power of the people absent a compelling reason.

Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 2314

Governor's Office, Sacramento

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 2314 without my signature.

This bill would revise disciplinary procedures for state managers. The bill removes the burden of proof for a disciplined managerial employee and eliminates the presumption that the notice of a disciplinary action is true. This bill impacts the state fiscally and creates an environment of lesser accountability among management employees.

AB 2314 would result in the state expending additional funds to defend these disciplinary actions by encouraging managerial employees to make an appeal to the State Personnel Board (SPB) of a Department's decisions regarding the adverse action process. Additionally, due to the State's fiscal crisis, the SPB has experienced significant budget reductions and would be unable to perform these new activities without additional funding.

Transferring the burden of proof in the appeals process to the state would create another redundant process. Adverse actions are only taken after correction actions have failed to rectify an employees' performance or behavior.

Therefore, I cannot support this measure at this time.

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 2989 without my signature.

I support the bill's goal to increase the number of registered nurses for California and to provide CalWORKs recipients with the opportunity to enroll in, and complete, registered nursing education programs that will assist them in obtaining higher paying jobs.

However, AB 2989 is unnecessary as its goals can be accomplished under the CalWORKs work reforms enacted in the Health and Human Services budget trailer bill, Senate Bill 1104 (Committee on Budget). SB 1104 eliminated the 18 and 24-month CalWORKs time limit on education activities and instead requires CalWORKs recipients to participate in work-related activities for 20 hours each week. CalWORKs participants in approved nursing programs will now be able to continue their education until they complete their program or reach the CalWORKs 60-month time limit, as long as they are progressing in their program and meeting program requirements.

Furthermore, legislation that establishes different program requirements for residents in only one county in California raises legal questions pertaining to the Federal Equal Protection Clause and the California Constitution.
