Assembly Bill 227 requires plans to pay capitation payments to contracting providers as of the date of enrollment of new enrollees, including retroactive payments. Thus, it is the intent of the Legislature to recognize there is a natural lag time that exists within the enrollment process and the provider selection process of a new enrollee. The language of AB 227 recognizes that physicians may begin to receive capitation payments sometime after enrollment of new enrollees but will also receive retroactive payments going back to enrollment.

This letter will ensure that there is no misunderstanding with the intent to provide capitation payments to contracting physicians.

It is my intention in authoring this resolution that the California Highway Patrol examine current statute as a component of the study and make its findings and recommendations accordingly.
