Explanation of Vote—Senate Bill No. 1538

August 27, 2004

The Honorable Fabian Nunez Speaker of the Assembly California State Assembly State Capitol, Room 219

RE: Senate Bill 1538 (Alarcon),

Compensation: meal and rest periods

Dear Mr. Speaker,

I write to express the intent behind my "aye" vote for Senate Bill (SB) 1538. SB 1538 seeks to clarify that a piece rate worker in the agricultural and garment industries is entitled to be paid for a rest period and provides a formula for determining compensation rates for piece rate workers. This bill passed the Assembly by a margin of 41–35 on August 26, 2004.

Although I voted "aye" for SB 1538 on August 27, 2004, it was done as a courtesy to Assembly Member Paul Koretz—a co-author who would have supported this measure on the Assembly Floor but was unable to vote due to personal/family circumstances.

The sponsors and the author meant well in carrying SB 1538. However, the language contained in SB 1538 is onerous and not necessary. The provisions set forth in this bill may have an unintentional, and potentially harmful, effect for small farmers and farmworkers in future years.

Dear Mr. Wilson: A question has arisen during the course of this legislation concerning an employer's obligation under Labor Code Section 213.5, newly enacted by AB 1723.

It is the intention of the author and the sponsor that the language of the bill that provides that an agricultural employer must comply with an employee's request by "implementing" direct deposit within 30 days means that the employer must provide all relevant information to the necessary financial institution(s) within that time period in order for direct deposit to be initiated.

The author and the sponsor acknowledge that the given financial institution(s) may take additional time to initiate the payment by direct deposit, but it is merely the intent of this legislation that the employer be required to provide the relevant information to the financial institution within the 30-day period.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1721

Dear Dotson: I have introduced Assembly Bill 1721 to prohibit retailers from charging a price higher than the lowest price that is posted on an item itself or a shelf tag that corresponds to the item. The lowest price would apply regardless of any posted time limitation for the sale price.

AB 1721 amends Section 12024.2 of the Business & Professions Code that was enacted prior to the now common use of computer scanners at check-out stands. This legislation enacts into law a requirement for retailers to charge the lowest price for the product that is displayed and not the higher original or regular price for the item. This requirement is consistent with the stated policy of most retailers in California and helps to prevent retailers who do not comply with this requirement from obtaining a competitive advantage over retailers who are in compliance.

Consumers reasonably expect that the price label and the shelf tag indicating the price of an item accurately reflect the price then charged for the item. Consumers may be easily confused by price labels or shelf price tags that do not state current prices such as a shelf price tag displaying a special "sale" price that is left on the shelf after the sale expiration date. Because of the volume of items in stores, the very large number of price labels and shelf price tags, the very limited size of shelf price tags and price labels that practically restrict the inclusion of meaningful information beyond the stated price itself, the confusing nature of expired or premature sale price tags on currently offered items, and the posting of the sale price tags at many different heights and locations, it is very difficult for consumers to notice or remember any time limitation placed on a posted price. Therefore, a disclosure provision requiring a certain size, typeface, or location specifying the limited duration of the sale would not effectively provide consumers with accurate sales price information or prevent posted expired or future "sale" price tags from being confusing.

Moreover, the posting of individual effective dates for each sale item does not adequately apprise consumers of the then applicable price for the item and only compounds consumers' confusion as to whether the posted price on the shelf or item is the currently effective price.

AB 1721 has been amended to address marketing concerns raised by some retailers so that the limitations on the expiration dates for sale items is narrowly drawn to address the problems that have been noted in the marketplace.

Finally, AB 1721 and the advertising prohibition contained therein are prospective in nature and are not intended in any way to affect advertising practices that occurred prior to the bill's effective date.

Dear Speaker Nunez and Assembly Member Steinberg: This letter follows a meeting held this afternoon between representatives of the California Student Aid Commission, EDFUND Board of Directors, and the major financial institutions that provide services in the student loan arena. During the course of this meeting we came to an agreement that recognizes the need for broad consultation with participating schools and lenders. As part of this agreement, the parties have agreed to use AB 2122 (Steinberg) to clarify existing statute concerning the Commission's efforts to diversify its student loan activities beyond the Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) Program. All parties have agreed that AB 2122 will be amended to include the provisions that were formerly in AB 598 (as amended on August 17, 2004).

This agreement also includes a commitment by the Commission to provide, on a monthly basis between now and the beginning of the 2005–06 Legislative session, a status report regarding these activities to the Legislative leadership and the Schwarzenegger administration.

The Commission has also stipulated to the lending community that amendments to the Commission's existing Operating Agreement relating to its proposed business diversification efforts will not be submitted until after January 3, 2005.

The Commission looks forward to working with each of you and members of the Legislature in successfully implementing a business diversification plan which will enable the Commission to continue to provide excellent student financial aid activities and benefits.

Statements of Legislative Intent Printed in Journal by Unanimous Consent

The following statements were printed in the Journal without objection:

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 3018

August 26, 2004

Mr. Dotson E. Wilson Chief Clerk of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 3196 Sacramento, California

Dear Mr. Wilson: A question has arisen during the course of this legislation as to how Labor Code section 512.7, newly enacted by AB 3018, would operate in conjunction with Labor Code section 512.5.

Labor Code section 512.5 allows the Industrial Welfare Commission (IWC) to create an exemption for meal period and rest break provisions for commercial drivers who are public employees. In accordance with Labor Code section 512.5, the Industrial Welfare Commission amended Wage Order 9 in 2003 and adopted regulations governing meal and rest break provisions for commercial drivers employed by governmental entities. Included in those regulations is an exemption for public transit drivers covered by collective bargaining agreements if certain protective conditions are met.

The provisions of AB 3018 that address commercial drivers are intended to and should be interpreted to be broadly applicable to all commercial drivers employed in the transportation industry, whether employed in the private or public sector. However, Labor Code section 512.5 grants the IWC the specific authority to establish special rules for commercial drivers in the public sector. It has exercised that authority and there is nothing in AB 3018 which should, in any way, affect existing provisions of Wage Order 9 governing meal periods and rest breaks for commercial drivers employed by governmental entities or the right of the IWC to take any future action pursuant to the provisions of Labor Code section 512.5 to fashion full or partial exemptions from meal period or rest break requirements.

AB 3018 deals with two very narrow situations; that is, when an on-duty meal period is permitted and when an off-duty meal period may

commence in situations where employees are covered by a collective bargaining agreement. In contrast, Labor Code section 512.5 grants the IWC the broad discretion to create exemptions pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement from both meal period and rest break provisions for a certain class of commercial drivers. If the IWC has taken action to exempt a public sector driver from meal period requirements pursuant to Labor Code section 512.5, then it is quite obvious that provisions of Labor Code section 512.7, which regulate the situations under which those meal periods are taken, would be inapplicable on its face.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am requesting that this letter be placed in the Daily Journal in order to reflect legislative intent for my measure AB 2136 relating to the rules and guidelines for the documentation of treatment costs for indigent patients by Narcotic Treatment Programs. It was not my intent or that of the other stakeholders to restrict the ability or authority of the Department to assess a program audit disallowances if the provider does not comply with the law. It is the intent of the legislation to clarify what those guidelines and rules are so that providers improve their compliance with the law.

The bill reflects several months of negotiations that produced a consensus solution by the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (DADP) and provider organizations to clarify the procedures related to the charges, documentation and audit requirements for indigent non-Medi-Cal eligible patients treated by Narcotic Treatment Providers (NTP's). This issue has burdened providers due to ambiguous procedures and inconsistent audit disallowances. Providers requested DADP clarification in 1997 because audit disallowances for indigent patients jeopardize their services for full pay and DMC patients.

The codified statutory intent language reflects the state's commitment to providing drug treatment to indigent patients. Equally important is the reference to the exception under federal law to the "usual and customary charge determination" rule for DMC reimbursement as long as the provider establishes a sliding scale for indigency fees. This shows that the provider is assessing each patient for their ability to pay based on their individual income and expenses.

NTP's usually have additional capacity to serve indigent patients who either do not have sufficient income, health care insurance or MediCal benefits to cover their drug treatment costs. If these patients can pay part of their treatment costs, most providers do serve some portion of this population. This benefits the patients, their families and their communities. Thank you.

RE: AB 2132 (Reyes), Asthma Medication: Pupil Self-Administration Dear Mr. Speaker: I write to express the intent behind the August 19 amendments to Assembly Bill (AB) 2132. AB 2132 sets forth the process for permitting a student to self-administer inhaled asthma medication at school.

As amended, the bill states that in order for a pupil to carry and self-administer prescription inhaled asthma medication, the school district shall obtain a specified written information statement from the physician and a written statement from the parent, foster parent or guardian consenting to the self-administration and providing a release for the school to consult with the health care provider and releasing the school district and school personnel from civil liability if the pupil suffers an adverse reaction by taking the medicine (Proposed Education Code Section 49423.1(b)(2) on page 3).

The liability release only applies to adverse reactions occurring as a result of the self-administering pupil under paragraph (2). This bill is double-joined to SB 1912, which clarifies the language and, as amended August 24, 2004, states that the release of the school district and school personnel applies if the self-administering pupil "suffers an adverse reaction as a result of self-administering medication pursuant to this paragraph." I would like to see Section 49423.1(b)(2) amended to be consistent with the language of SB 1912, but because of legislative deadlines, this must occur next year.

Dear Mr. Speaker: I have been asked to reiterate my intent with respect to several provisions in AB 2055 dealing with agriculture and open space.

- 1. Cities and counties retain their current broad discretion under Section 65564 to address their obligation to prepare an action program they believe to be locally appropriate. While I would encourage both to review the program options under Section 65565, I recognize that many built-out urban cities have little or no agricultural and open space land, and few opportunities to find more, and that circumstances between and within counties with respect to agricultural and open space resources, uses, opportunities, and priorities vary greatly. Cities and counties also retain their current discretion to express their agricultural and open space programs and policies in separate optional elements, such as an agricultural element, or include them in other required elements, such as the conservation or land use elements.
- 2. I included the optional provisions for urban and transitional areas in Section 65565(c) to recognize that maintaining agricultural and open space uses and opportunities in urban and transitional areas may require difference strategies than those appropriate for other areas. For example, agriculture in urban areas is often dependent upon the willingness of public and private landowners to make land available to agricultural tenants, and the provision of incentives and avoidance of disincentives may be the most effective policy.
- 3. In providing in Section 65565 for separate inventories and policies with respect to farmland and open space, I recognize that these categories may often overlap on many parcels of land and may change over time. AB 2055 is not intended to interfere with the current discretion of landowners and local governments to determine the relative importance, in the local context, of various types of agricultural and open space uses, nor is it intended to interfere with the ability of the landowner to select an open space use to the exclusion of an agricultural use, or vice versa, when conjunctive use is impractical. For example, grazing land which also supports habitat might be converted to irrigated crop land, or alternatively, dedicated exclusively to habitat, with landowner consent, to implement a local NCCP plan.
- 4. Cities and counties are intended to retain their current discretion to balance and harmonize policies in their agricultural and open space elements with policies in their other general plan elements. For example, interim agricultural and open space policies may be appropriate in

areas that may ultimately be required to meet housing needs, while other areas may be appropriate for long-term agricultural and open space commitments and strategies, including protection against development impacts.

Dear Mr. Wilson: Assembly Bill 1297 (Frommer) was approved by the Assembly today and now proceeds to enrollment. I want to reiterate that the purpose of this bill, as reported by the Assembly Committee on Revenue & Taxation in its August 26, 2004 analysis, is to make specific that it is against the public policy of the State for an insurance policy to provide insurance coverage for, or a duty to defend against claims for, losses, taxes, penalties, interest, fines or reimbursement attributable to an abusive tax avoidance transaction.

The operative provisions of proposed Section 254 of the Insurance Code (as embodied in Section 1 of the Bill) nullify and eliminate the economic benefits of insurance intended specifically to cover the loss of tax benefits arising from abusive tax avoidance transactions and listed transactions, as defined. Section 2 of the Bill (which adds Section 19188 to the Revenue & Taxation Code) specifies that the taxing provisions of

the Bill only apply to insurance proceeds received from a policy which provides coverage for risks specified in proposed Section 254 of the Insurance Code.

Neither Section of this Bill applies, or should be construed to apply, to general professional liability or errors & omissions policies of insurance, or to the proceeds of any such policies.

Dear Mr. Speaker: I respectfully request this letter be entered into the Assembly Journal to clarify the legislative intent of AB 2151.

The federal government has created the 340B discount drug program to provide lower cost drugs to specified health programs, including Title X family planning programs. The federal law requires that these "covered entities" must receive a dispensing fee for providing this service to their patients. AB 2151 codifies the federal dispensing fee requirement without altering the current Medi-Cal or Family PACT reimbursement provided to community claims.

Due to a drafting error by Legislative Counsel, AB 2151 inadvertently references Welfare and Institutions Code §141532.100(k) with regard to the exemption from the provisions of the bill for federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) and rural health clinics (RHCs). This code section does not exist. The correct reference should be Welfare and Institutions Code Section 14132.100(k), which allows FQHCs and RHCs to elect to be reimbursed for pharmacy costs based on the prospective payment rate. FQHCs and RHCs that make such an election are intended to be exempt from the provisions of AB 2151.

This letter is intended to provide direction to the Department of Health Services so that when it updates its regulations to reflect the changes in AB 2151, the changes reflect the legislative intent expressed herein.

Dear Dotson: A question concerning provisions of my bill, AB 2286, relative to Section 44468 of the Education Code, has arisen which needs clarification. This code section deals with an expedited internship route for teaching credential candidates who can demonstrate their

knowledge, skills and abilities through written and performance assessments. These individuals would be required to meet all statutory requirements for a teaching credential, but would be able to earn their credential more quickly through this route. Currently, Education Code Section 44468 pertains to multiple subject and single subject teaching credentials. AB 2286 would add special education credentials for students with mild to moderate disabilities.

I would like to clarify that the Commission on Teacher Credentialing would be required to adopt a test covering teaching competence in special education for teachers of students with mild to moderate disabilities. Special education stakeholders would be involved in the review of the exam used for these purposes. Additionally, the teaching performance assessment to take place during the internship would be based on the current teacher preparation program fieldwork assessment standards for the Education Specialist Credential in Special Education: Mild/Moderate Disabilities.

I submit this letter as my clarification of the intent of AB 2286 and that of the Legislature in enacting this measure.

This section requires publishers to make instructional materials available in an electronic multimedia format for purchase by districts consisting of grades K–12, effective 2007.

I submit this letter as clarification of AB 1010's intent—and that of the Legislature in enacting this measure, which is as follows:

If a school or school district decides to utilize instructional materials in an electronic multimedia format for their students, that school or school district shall provide the student or the student's parent with the option of utilizing a hardcopy textbook version of the instructional material or the electronic multimedia format version.

If a school or school district decides to utilize instructional materials in an electronic multimedia format for their students, that school or school district shall certify with the student's parent or guardian that equipment is available in working order for use by the student, either at the school site or at the student's home, so the student can reasonably access the electronic multimedia format instructional materials. The

school or school district shall also certify with the student's parent or guardian that the student will have access to the equipment for reasonable amounts of time throughout the day for homework purposes.

AB 2066 aligns California with the federal requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 by creating a framework of statewide assistance for identified Local Education Agencies (LEAs). Specifically, AB 2066 requires participating LEAs to contract with qualified external providers to conduct a self-assessment and implement solutions to identified shortcomings. In addition, participating LEAs are required to "work with" a county superintendent to ensure community participation and awareness.

Education stakeholders have expressed confusion regarding the term "work with" in subparagraph (1)(B) of paragraph (b) and subparagraph (1)(B) of paragraph (c) in section 52055.57 of the

Education Code. As the author, the intent of the term is to make certain that participating Local Education Agencies are working with a County Superintendent for the purpose of preparing to contract with a county office of education or other external entity. The term is not to require LEAs to receive contract approval from the county superintendent.
