**Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1412**

August 27, 2002

*The Honorable Herb J. Wesson, Jr.*

*Speaker*

*State Assembly*

*Sacramento, California*

Dear Speaker Wesson: AB 1412 (Wright) simply allows school districts the opportunity to provide career and technical education courses to high school students with the necessary academic content for these courses to also be used for college admissions purposes.

This bill does not require local school districts to change existing curriculum or alter in any way the delivery of career and technical education courses. If a local district chooses to adopt new curriculum for career and technical education courses pursuant to the opportunities provided by this bill they may do so by using federal resources allocated to this state for those purposes in the federal Carl D. Perkins Act, Section 135, related to local uses of funds.

As the author of this measure I have always intended, and Legislative Counsel has concurred, that the contents of AB 1412 are permissive. They do not constitute the grounds for a state mandated local program and cannot be used for the purposes of any future claim by local districts for state reimbursable costs.

I respectfully request that this letter be printed in the Assembly Journal.

WHEREAS, Elected to the California State Assembly in 1996 to represent the 32nd District, which includes Kern and Tulare Counties, Roy Ashburn brought with him to the Capitol 12 years of experience obtained as a Kern County Supervisor; and

WHEREAS, As a Member of the Assembly, Roy Ashburn tackled a number of important issues facing local cities and counties, as well as the state, and his efforts focused on reforming California's welfare system, reducing crime and increasing public safety, and cutting taxes and advocating for greater local control, and he also pioneered California's effort in developing the Valley Fever Vaccine Research Project; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Member Ashburn's legislative work is highlighted by his leadership in authoring California's "Welfare-to-Work Act of 1997"; and

WHEREAS, Roy Ashburn earned a degree in public administration from California State University, Bakersfield, and he has been active in the community as President of the San Joaquin Valley Supervisor's Association and Director of the California State Association of Counties, Director of the Coalition for Private Property Rights, a founder of the Kern Transportation Foundation, and a member of the Kern County Board of Retirement; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Member Ashburn and his wife, Diane, reside in Bakersfield with their four daughters, Shelley, Shannon, Stacy, and Suzannah; and

WHEREAS, Through his public service activities he has made a significant impact on the people of the 32nd Assembly District and throughout the state, and he will be greatly missed by those individuals with whom he has been associated; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, The tenure of the Honorable Robert M. Hertzberg with the California State Assembly is drawing to a close following six years of exemplary service, and it is appropriate at this time to highlight the many achievements of his illustrious tenure and to extend to him the highest commendations of the people of the state; and

WHEREAS, Twice elected by acclamation as Speaker of the Assembly and now Speaker Emeritus, Robert Hertzberg devoted his time in office to solving today's problems while helping to build the California of tomorrow; and

WHEREAS, Chosen as Speaker in January 2000, Robert Hertzberg led the charge as California made record investments to improve public schools, build affordable housing, and increase recreational areas; and

WHEREAS, Robert Hertzberg was the chief Assembly architect of California's response to the energy crisis, successfully crafting policies that kept the lights on and brought spiraling electricity prices under control; and

WHEREAS, In the aftermath of September 11, 2001, he moved quickly to establish a statewide task force to assess the impact on California's economy, and to recommend steps to improve public safety and restore public confidence, and, previously, in 1999, he authored the Hertzberg-Alarcon California Prevention of Terrorism Act, which was the first state legislation to criminalize the use of weapons of mass destruction; and

WHEREAS, As Speaker, Robert Hertzberg championed efforts to tap California's unlimited potential by expanding opportunity for all, and under his leadership, the Legislature enacted long-needed reforms to the state's foster care system, significantly expanded access to low-cost health insurance for working families, adopted a historic expansion of Cal Grants to allow virtually every needy high-school graduate to pursue a college education, and helped pass the two largest park bonds in California history; and

WHEREAS, During his tenure as Speaker, he helped define the role of the community college system as the "classroom for the new economy," and his efforts generated unprecedented investment in community colleges, which currently enroll more than 29 percent of the state's high school graduates; and

WHEREAS, Robert Hertzberg's personal legislative achievements include the enactment of landmark measures to protect the rights of farmworkers and, after several years of work, the enactment in 1999 of the Woman's Contraception Equity Act, which requires health plans to provide coverage for birth control; and

WHEREAS, As his first act as Speaker, Robert Hertzberg established the Speaker's Office of Oversight, in an effort to restore the Legislature's historic watchdog role over government operations; and

WHEREAS, His efforts to provide police and prosecutors with the latest techniques available resulted in the enactment of legislation authored by Robert Hertzberg that created a statewide witness protection program and created a pilot program "311" system to clear jammed police phone lines for true emergency calls; and

WHEREAS, As Speaker, Robert Hertzberg served as a member of the University of California's Board of Regents, and as a trustee to the California State University system, and in those capacities he helped minority students gain greater access to higher education; and

WHEREAS, Prior to his selection as Speaker, Robert Hertzberg served as Chair of the Assembly's powerful Rules Committee, where he worked to modernize the Assembly in a term-limited era, established the Capitol Institute—renamed by his colleagues as the Robert M. Hertzberg Capitol Institute—to provide training courses for freshman members and legislative staff, opened an onsite child care center, and upgraded technology throughout the Assembly; and

WHEREAS, Robert Hertzberg served as the Assembly's lead negotiator on a number of matters, including marathon efforts that led to passage in 1998 of a \$9.2 billion school construction bond, plus the placement of \$25.3 billion in additional school construction bonds—the largest in state history—on the November 2002 and March 2004 ballots; and

WHEREAS, First elected to the Assembly in 1996, Robert Hertzberg assumed a leading role in the Assembly from the start of his tenure, and he was the first freshman ever named Chair of the Committee on Public Safety, which is responsible for considering more than 500 bills each session relating to crime and law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Prior to his election, he served on the Los Angeles County Quality and Productivity Commission, spearheading efforts to increase government efficiency, and his other contributions to government include serving as Chair of the California Advisory Commission on Youth (1978–79) and as a member of the California State Board of Pharmacy (1984–88); and

WHEREAS, He has served on the board of directors of a variety of community organizations, including CORO Associates, the Chinatown Service Center, Mulholland Tomorrow, and from 1991 to 1995, he was Chair of the Dean's Council of Hebrew Union College and Vice President of the American Jewish Committee; and

WHEREAS, Robert Hertzberg graduated magna cum laude from the University of Redlands and from the University of California, Hastings College of the Law, and he worked as a business and real estate attorney after years of practicing as a constitutional lawyer; and

WHEREAS, Robert Hertzberg is married to Dr. Cynthia Telles-Hertzberg, a faculty member at the University of California, Los Angeles, School of Medicine, and together, they have three sons, Daniel, David, and Raymond; now, therefore, be it
