**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 15—Nakanishi. An act relating to sex offenders.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 16—Lieber (Coauthor: Senator Speier). An act to add Section 6259.1 to the Penal Code, relating to corrections.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 17—Committee on Correctional Policy and Fiscal Issues (Leno (Chair), Bass, Chu, Laird, and Lieber). An act to add Chapter 3.21 (commencing with Section 15819.34) and Chapter 3.22 (commencing with Section 15819.38) to Part 10b of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, to amend Sections 7003, 7003.5, and 13602 of, to add Sections 7021 and 7004.5 to, and to add Chapter 9.8 (commencing with Section 6270) to Title 7 of Part 3 of, the Penal Code, and to repeal Section 2.5 of Chapter 1416 of the Statutes of 1987, relating to prisons, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 18—Committee on Correctional Policy and Fiscal Issues (Leno (Chair), Bass, Chu, Laird, and Lieber). An act to amend Section 2911 of the Penal Code, relating to inmate transfers.
