One last reflection on Ryokan Taigu's haiku: "Showing Front; Showing Back; Maple Leaves Fall."

There is no pretension in Ryokan's haiku. This haiku reflects every autumn that humankind has known; and we quietly embrace the naturalness of the moment. A true haiku is an experiential commentary on the nature of things just as they are; and there is no feeling that a person is even speaking. There is a selfless quality to a true haiku; and there was a selfless quality to Ryokan Taigu. Interestingly—although in his lifetime he refused to be honored as a poet, teacher, or philosopher—still, over the past 200 years, he continues to be admired and honored.

In a very deep way, Ryokan's life reflected the truth of the Persian Spiritual Poet, Rumi. Rumi would say, "When we stop admiring ourselves, then all we do will become admirable." Although separated by 500 years and half a world away, Ryokan's life and his selfless poetry embodied the wisdom shared by Rumi. They both remain inspirations and reminders that we must try to live without pretension and self-centered admiration.
