#### Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1029

August 21, 2023

Sue Parker Chief Clerk of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 319 Sacramento, California

Dear Ms. Parker: I write to express my intent in authoring Assembly Bill (AB) 1029 related to Psychiatric Advance Directives. AB 1029 takes the definition of Psychiatric Advance Directives, enacted last year in the CARE Act or Senate Bill 1338 (Umberg and Eggman, Chapter 319, Statutes of 2022), and adds it to the Health Care Decision laws in the Probate Code.

There are also a few changes intended to clean up some confusion from AB 2288 (Choi, Chapter 21, Statutes of 2022), enacted last year. In making sure Advance Health Care Directives include mental health, AB 2288 inadvertently added some uncertainty to the law. AB 1029 makes clarifying changes and restates in the statutory Advance Health Care Directive form five types of procedures to which an agent may not consent under Probate Code Section 4652. My bill does not seek to change any standards or requirements under current law governing advance directives, nor does it seek to undermine the medical legitimacy of the five procedures listed under Probate Code Section 4652.

Thank you for the opportunity to clarify the intent of the changes proposed by AB 1029.
