The newly amended language of this section; it was not intended to broaden the application of subdivision (b) of Section 1383.15, regarding full-service health care service plans. Its only intent was to apply the bill's provisions to specialized health plans. The phrase "or other licensed health care provider" should not have been added to the first sentence of that subdivision, and the related provision in the Insurance Code, and will be deleted by legislation next year.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The intent of AB 1066 is to assist federally recognized tribal nations within the state of California to enter into agreements with CALTRANS to develop and complete transportation projects that fit the criteria of the legislation and provide economic, social and safety benefits for the tribes.

While the legislation would allow CALTRANS to enter into applicable and appropriate government-to-government agreements, the legislation is not designed or meant to impede or weaken the sovereign rights of tribal nations. Indeed, this bill seeks to strengthen tribal governments and their right to self-governance, which has been affirmed by previous actions brought forth by the Congress and the President of the United States aimed to support economic development, self-sufficiency and self-governance on tribal lands.

The sovereign rights of tribal nations and the powers invested in the legally appointed and elected representatives of tribal councils to create and implement tribal laws remain fully intact. This legislation has no bearing or impact on those powers.

It is the intent of the Legislature, in enacting Assembly Bill 2414, to balance the protection of individually identifiable medical information from unwanted disclosure with the need to allow easy access to disease management services by enrollees of health plans. In defining a disease management organization, it is the intent of AB 2414 to statutorily govern the relationship between an enrollee of a health care service plan and a disease management organization with which the plan has a contract and to which the plan discloses medical information. AB 2414 does not authorize the promulgation of administrative regulations by any board, commission, or administrative agency.

When, as part of the delivery of a covered pharmaceutical benefit, a pharmaceutical benefit manager or management company ("PBM") receives personally identifiable information and provides health plan enrollees or subscribers with patient compliance information or educational materials on how to maintain and improve their overall health, the PBM is not considered a disease management organization

for the purposes of the requirements set forth in subsection (17), unless the PBM also provides other disease management services, programs, or products, such as those defined in Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 1399.900) of the Health and Safety Code. However, a PBM is intended to continue to be governed by the other provisions and limitations set forth in Section 56.10.

My bill, AB 2423, exempts wholly owned subsidiaries, parent companies, and other subsidiary companies, as specified of persons licensed under the clinical laboratory licensing law and who own or operate clinical laboratories, from certain billing restrictions. The legislation passed all committees and both houses of the Legislature without a dissenting vote.

The purpose of the bill is to clarify that existing law requiring disclosure of charges and prohibiting "mark ups" of those charges by clinical laboratories does not prohibit common internal accounting practices within a business organization and its various subsidiaries that own or operate multiple clinical laboratories which refer and perform tests internally.

The exemption provided in AB 2423 for subsidiaries "owned or operated" by a common parent organization is intended to apply to both for-profit and non-profit entities.

FEHA: COMMON-LAW CAUSES OF ACTION—#19789

Dear Mr. Torlakson:

QUESTION NO. 1

Does the California Fair Employment and Housing Act preclude a person from bringing a civil action against a private employer for employment discrimination based on common-law causes of action, including intentional and negligent infliction of emotional distress?

OPINION NO. 1

The California Fair Employment and Housing Act does not preclude a person from bringing a civil action against a private employer for employment discrimination based on common-law causes of action, including intentional and negligent infliction of emotional distress.

ANALYSIS NO. 1

By way of background, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act (Pt. 2.8 (commencing with Sec. 12900), Div. 3, Title 2, Gov. C.; hereafter the FEHA or the act) establishes a comprehensive scheme designed to eliminate discriminatory practices in employment (Sec. 12920). In this regard, the FEHA generally prohibits discrimination in employment on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, or age (Secs. 12940 and 12941). The act further makes it unlawful for any employer, among others, to fail to take all reasonable steps necessary to prevent discrimination and harassment from occurring (subd. (i), Sec. 12940).

The FEHA establishes two administrative bodies, the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (hereafter the department) and the Fair Employment and Housing Commission (hereafter the commission), to enforce and implement the act. The department is charged with the responsibility, among other things, to investigate, conciliate, and seek redress of claimed discrimination (Sec. 12930), while the commission generally performs adjudicatory and rulemaking functions (Sec. 12935).

As a prerequisite to the filing of a civil action for an unlawful practice under the FEHA, an aggrieved person is first required to exhaust his or her administrative remedy under the act (Romano v. Rockwell Internat., *Inc.* (1996) 14 Cal.4th 479, 492). In this regard, the FEHA provides that any person claiming to be aggrieved by an alleged unlawful practice may file a verified complaint with the department (Sec. 12960). Upon the receipt of a sufficient complaint, the department is required to promptly investigate the allegations contained in the complaint (Sec. 12963). If the department determines that the complaint is valid, the department is required to "immediately endeavor" to eliminate the unlawful employment practice by conference, conciliation, and persuasion (Sec. 12963.7). If the unlawful practice is not eliminated, or upon other specified circumstances, the Director of Fair Employment and Housing may issue a written accusation to be heard by the commission (subd. (a), Sec. 12965 and Sec. 12969). After an accusation is issued, the department's attorneys or agents present the case in support of the accusation to the commission (Sec. 12969).

If an accusation or amended accusation includes a prayer either for damages for emotional injuries as a component of actual damages, or for administrative fines, or for both, the respondent may, within 30 days after service of the accusation or amended accusation, elect to transfer the proceedings to a court in lieu of a hearing by serving a written notice to that effect on the department, the commission, and the person claiming to be aggrieved (para. (1), subd. (c), Sec. 12965). No later than 30 days after the completion of service of the notice of election, the department is required to dismiss the accusation and, either itself or, at its election, through the Attorney General, file in the appropriate court

² With regard to the sale or rental of housing, the act also prohibits the owner of any housing accommodation from engaging in enumerated acts of discrimination based upon any of the protected categories set forth in the analysis above (Art. 2 (commencing with Sec. 12955), Ch. 6, Div. 2.8, Title 2).

an action in its own name on behalf of the person claiming to be aggrieved as the real party in interest (Ibid.).

If the department does not issue an accusation within 150 days after the filing of a complaint, or if the department determines at an earlier time that it will not issue an accusation, the department is required to notify the aggrieved person that he or she may file a civil action under the FEHA (subd. (b), Sec. 12965). This notice is generally referred to as a "right to sue" letter. Only upon receipt of this letter may the aggrieved person bring a civil action under the FEHA (*Rojo* v. *Kliger* (1990) 52 Cal.3d 65, 72 (hereafter *Rojo*); *Commodore Home Systems, Inc.* v. *Superior Court* (1982) 32 Cal.3d 211, 214).

The question presented here is whether the FEHA provides the exclusive remedy for injuries arising from employment discrimination, or whether an aggrieved person may also pursue common-law causes of action arising out of that discrimination, such as intentional and negligent infliction of emotional distress.

The California Supreme Court addressed this issue in *Rojo*, supra. In that case, two women brought suit against an employer for sex discrimination in violation of the FEHA and also alleged a cause of action for intentional infliction of emotional distress. With respect to the cause of action for intentional infliction of emotional distress, the defendant moved for summary judgment on the ground that the FEHA constituted plaintiffs' exclusive remedy for employment discrimination (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 71).

The Supreme Court upheld plaintiffs' cause of action for intentional infliction of emotional distress, holding that the FEHA does not displace any cause of action or remedy that is otherwise available to a plaintiff (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 82). In reaching this conclusion, the court conducted an extensive review of the language and history of the FEHA, and also analyzed prior case law.

The court first noted that the FEHA expressly disclaims any intent to repeal other state laws relating to employment discrimination. In this regard, Section 12993 reads, in relevant part, as follows:

"12993. (a) The provisions of this part shall be construed liberally for the accomplishment of the purposes of this part. Nothing contained in this part shall be deemed to repeal any of the provisions of the Civil Rights Law or of any other law of this state relating to discrimination because of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, age, or sexual orientation, unless those provisions provide less protection to the enumerated classes of persons covered under this part.

* * *

"(c) While it is the intention of the Legislature to occupy the field of regulation of discrimination in employment and housing encompassed by the provisions of this part, exclusive of all other laws banning discrimination in employment and housing by any city, city and county, county, or other political subdivision of the state, nothing contained in this part shall be construed, in any manner or way, to limit or restrict the application of Section 51 of the Civil Code."

As can be seen, subdivision (a) of Section 12993 expressly provides that nothing in the FEHA "shall be deemed to repeal any of the provisions of any . . . law of this state relating to discrimination" As explained by the *Rojo* court, the "law" of this state includes the common law as well as the California Constitution and the codes (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 74). Further, the *Rojo* court noted that the common law provides any number of remedial theories to compensate for injuries relating to discrimination (Ibid.). In support of this assertion, the court cited to its prior opinion in *Brown* v. *Superior Court* (1984) 37 Cal.3d 477, in which the court allowed an employment discrimination plaintiff to pursue common-law causes of action for wrongful discharge and emotional distress (see also *Alcorn* v. *Anbro Engineering, Inc.* (1970) 2 Cal.3d 493, allowing plaintiff to pursue actual and exemplary damages for alleged claim of intentional infliction of emotional distress based on race discrimination).

Notwithstanding the clear language contained in subdivision (a) of Section 12993, the defendant in *Rojo* argued that subdivision (c) of that section expresses legislative intent that the FEHA supersede all preexisting state laws, except for Section 51 of the Civil Code.³ As quoted above, subdivision (c) of Section 12993 states the intent of the Legislature that the FEHA "occupy the field of regulation . . . exclusive of all other laws banning discrimination in employment . . . by any city, city and county, county, or other political subdivision of the state." After a thorough review of the legislative history of the FEHA and its predecessor acts, the California Fair Employment Practices Act (former Pt. 4.5 (commencing with Sec. 1410), Div. 2, Lab. C.) and the Rumford Fair Housing Act (former Pt. 5 (commencing with Sec. 35700), Div. 24, H. & S.C.), the court held that the language contained in subdivision (c) of Section 12993 indicates legislative intent to preempt only local laws banning discrimination and not state anti-discrimination laws (Rojo, supra, at p. 78).

The court also rejected the defendant's argument that the "new right—exclusive remedy" rule of statutory construction and its counterpart, the doctrine of "pre-existing right—cumulative remedies," applied to the FEHA to preclude a common-law cause of action for employment discrimination. These rules of statutory construction provide that when a statute creates a right that did not exist at common law, and provides a comprehensive and detailed remedial scheme for its enforcement, the statutory remedy is exclusive (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 79, citing *Flores* v. *Los Angeles Turf Club* (1961) 55 Cal.2d 736, 746–747). However, where a statutory remedy is provided for a preexisting common-law right, the newer remedy is generally considered to be cumulative, and the older remedy may be pursued at the plaintiff's election (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 79, citing *Flores*, supra, at p. 747).

³ Section 51 of the Civil Code contains the Unruh Civil Rights Act, which provides, among other things, that "[a]ll persons within the jurisdiction of this state are free and equal, and no matter what their sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, or disability are entitled to the full and equal accommodations, advantages, facilities, privileges, or services in all business establishments of every kind whatsoever."

The *Rojo* court found that it was unnecessary to apply these statutory rules of construction because, as discussed above, the relevant language of the FEHA is clear in disclaiming any intent to repeal any other law relating to discrimination; where statutory language is clear, a court need not and should not resort to artificial canons of statutory construction (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 79, citing *Soldberg* v. *Superior Court* (1977) 19 Cal.3d 182, 198). Further, as discussed above, the common law provides a variety of means independent of the FEHA to redress injuries arising from employment discrimination and, therefore, the court found, that even under the rules of statutory construction described above, the FEHA would be construed to provide a cumulative, rather than an exclusive, remedy for employment discrimination (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 79).

Finally, the court rejected defendant's reliance on several prior court of appeal cases, and federal cases applying California law, which had held that the FEHA provides the exclusive remedy for injuries relating to employment discrimination (see, for example, Ficalora v. Lockheed Corp. (1987) 193 Cal. App. 3d 489; Strauss v. A. L. Randall Co. (1983) 144 Cal.App.3d 514; Cook v. Lindsay Olive Growers (9th Cir. 1990) 911 F.2d 233; Baker v. Kaiser Aluminum Chemical Corp. (N.D. Cal. 1984) 608 F.Supp. 1315). According to the court, one line of cases erroneously construed subdivision (c) of Section 12993 as evidence of legislative intent to occupy the entire field of discrimination regulation (see Ficalora v. Lockheed Corp., supra, at p. 492), while the second line of cases improperly applied the "new right—exclusive remedy" doctrine (see Strauss v. A. L. Randall Co., supra, at p. 520). The court reiterated its prior findings that the FEHA preempts only local laws prohibiting discrimination, and that it does not displace other state law remedies for discrimination, including common-law remedies (Rojo, supra, at pp. 81–82).

Following the court's holding that the FEHA does not preclude a plaintiff from asserting a common-law cause of action arising out of employment discrimination, the court further held that a plaintiff is not required to exhaust the FEHA administrative process prior to seeking judicial relief for those causes of action (*Rojo*, supra, at p. 88). Thus, a plaintiff may elect to waive the FEHA cause of action and remedies, and proceed directly to court on the common law claims. Alternatively, a plaintiff may pursue both the administrative and judicial avenues, either sequentially or simultaneously, in the latter case amending his or her complaint to join the FEHA cause of action once the department has issued a right to sue letter (Ibid.).

Although the complaint in *Rojo* specifically included a common law cause of action for intentional infliction of emotional distress, we think that the court's broad holding that the FEHA does not displace other state law remedies for discrimination, including common law remedies, applies equally to other common law causes of action, including negligent infliction of emotional distress (see, for example, *Fretland* v. *County of Humboldt* (1999) 69 Cal.App.4th 1478, in which the court allowed the plaintiff to plead a cause of action for a violation of the FEHA, along with common law causes of action for both intentional and negligent infliction of emotional distress).

Based on the above case law, it is our opinion that the California Fair Employment and Housing Act does not preclude a person from bringing a civil action against a private employer for employment discrimination based on common-law causes of action, including intentional and negligent infliction of emotional distress.

QUESTION NO. 2

Does the workers' compensation exclusive remedy rule preclude a worker, who is the victim of discrimination in the workplace that violates the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, from pursuing and collecting an award from his or her employer for damages for the negligent infliction of emotional distress caused by that discrimination?

OPINION NO. 2

The workers' compensation exclusive remedy rule does not preclude a worker, who is the victim of discrimination in the workplace that violates the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, from pursuing and collecting an award for damages for the negligent infliction of emotional distress caused by that discrimination.

ANALYSIS NO. 2

As discussed in Analysis No. 1 above, the FEHA establishes a comprehensive scheme designed to eliminate discriminatory practices in employment (Sec. 12920). In this regard, the FEHA generally prohibits discrimination in employment and harassment in the workplace on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, or age (Secs. 12940 and 12941). Under the FEHA an award may include damages for emotional distress (see *Romano* v. *Rockwell Internat., Inc.*, supra, at p. 492; Sec. 12935; para. (1), subd. (c), Sec. 12965). Further, as discussed in Analysis No. 1 above, the FEHA does not displace other state legal remedies for discrimination, including a common-law cause of action for negligent infliction of emotional distress based on discrimination.

The Labor Code grants the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board (hereafter WCAB) exclusive jurisdiction over workers' compensation proceedings (see Sec. 5300, Lab. C.; see also *Castro* v. *Fowler Equip. Co.* (1965) 233 Cal.App.2d 416, 421). Section 3600 of the Labor Code establishes the conditions for compensation under workers' compensation. Section 3602 of the Labor Code provides, with exceptions not applicable to this analysis, that when compensation is payable under Section 3600 of the Labor Code, the right to recover that compensation is "the sole and exclusive remedy of the employee or his or her dependents against the employer . . ." (subd. (a), Sec. 3602, Lab. C.). A related exclusive remedy provision, Section 3601 of the Labor Code, prohibits actions by injured workers against their coworkers, with exceptions for injuries the coworkers cause when acting within the scope of their employment. Thus, unless an exception is applicable, when the elements of compensability ⁴ in Section 3600 of the Labor

⁴ These conditions include requirements that the employer and employee be subject to the Workers' Compensation Act, that the injury occur while the employee is performing employment-related services, and that the injury be proximately caused by the employment (Sec. 3600, Lab. C.).

Code are met, an injured worker's sole remedy against the employer is workers' compensation (Sec. 3602, Lab. C.; *Cole v. Fair Oaks Fire Protection Dist.* (1987) 43 Cal.3d 148, 158). The rationale for the "exclusive remedy rule" was described by the California Supreme Court in *Shoemaker v. Myers* (1990) 52 Cal.3d 1, as follows:

"[T]he employer assumes liability for industrial personal injury or death without regard to fault in exchange for limitations on the amount or the liability. The employee is afforded relatively swift and certain payment of benefits to cure or relieve the effects of industrial injury without having to prove fault but, in exchange, gives up the wider range of damages potentially available in tort. [Citations omitted.] The function of the exclusive remedy provisions is to give efficacy to the theoretical 'compensation bargain.' "(Id., at p. 16.)

The court recognized, however, that there may be exceptions, express or implied, to the exclusive remedy rule:

"We conclude that disabling injuries, whether physical or mental, arising from termination of employment are generally within the coverage of workers' compensation and subject to the exclusive remedy provisions, unless the discharge comes within an express or implied statutory exception or the discharge results from risks reasonably deemed not to be within the compensation bargain." (Shoemaker v. Myers, supra, at p. 7; emphasis added.)

Examples of conduct not stemming "from a risk reasonably encompassed within the compensation bargain" include false imprisonment (*Fermino* v. *Fedco, Inc.* (1994) 7 Cal.4th 701, 723), the termination of a state civil service employee for whistleblowing (*Shoemaker* v. *Myers*, supra, at pp. 22–23) and sexual harassment (*Accardi* v. *Superior Court* (1993) 17 Cal.App.4th 341, 353).

Further, an employer's violation of an important public policy may take an injured employee's action out of the workers' compensation exclusive remedy rule and permit the employee to sue his or her employer in court (see *Gantt* v. *Sentry Ins.* (1992) 1 Cal.4th 1083, 1098). In *Gantt* v. *Sentry Ins.*, the California Supreme Court held that "a termination for testifying truthfully concerning a coworker's sexual harassment claim in the context of an administrative investigation is actionable under Tameny [cit. omit.] . . . [and] that neither the FEHA nor the Workers' Compensation Act preempts the claim" (Id., at pp. 1086 and 1087). In addition, in *Fretland* v. *County of Humboldt*, supra; hereafter *Fretland*), the Court of Appeal held that the exclusive remedy rule does not bar an employee's claim for work-related injury discrimination in violation of FEHA (Id., at p. 1484), and does not bar a claim for emotional distress damages for work-related injury discrimination (Id., at p. 1492).

Fretland's second cause of action for discrimination was for "discrimination and harassment based upon physical handicaps" in violation of the FEHA (Fretland, supra, at p. 1483). The trial court "found that it was undisputed that the discrimination and harassment claim 'arose out of an industrial injury' "(Fretland, supra, at p. 1483). Fretland's eighth and ninth causes of action were for intentional and negligent infliction of emotional distress arising from the discrimination (Id., at pp. 1491–1492). The Court of Appeal in Fretland held that

neither the second cause of action (Id., at p. 1486) nor the eighth and ninth causes of action (Id., at p. 1492) were barred by the exclusive remedy provisions of the workers' compensation law. The Court of Appeal in *Fretland* reached these holdings based on an analysis of the California Supreme Court's decision in *City of Moorpark* v. *Superior Court* (1998) 18 Cal.4th 1143 (hereafter *City of Moorpark*) and *Cole* v. *Fair Oaks Fire District Protection Dist.*, supra (hereafter *Cole*).

In *City of Moorpark*, the California Supreme Court held that Section 132a of the Labor Code, which states that it is the policy of this state "that there should not be discrimination against workers who are injured in the course and scope of their employment," is not the exclusive remedy for work-related injury discrimination. In *City of Moorpark*, the California Supreme Court "emphasized the broad scope of the FEHA and concluded it would be inconsistent with the purpose of that legislation to limit its applicability to disabilities unrelated to work" (*Fretland*, supra, at p. 1485). Thus, the court in *Fretland* reasoned that "*City of Moorpark* establishes that ". . . section 132a does not provide an exclusive remedy and does not preclude an employee from pursuing FEHA and common law wrongful discharge remedies" (Ibid.).

In *Cole*, the California Supreme Court held that "when the employee's [emotional distress] claim is based on conduct normally occurring in the workplace, it is within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board" (*Fretland*, supra, at p. 1492). The Court of Appeal in *Fretland*, however, stated that "*Cole* does not prohibit all emotional distress causes of action against an employer, but only those based on conduct that is a normal risk of the employment relationship" (Ibid.). The Court of Appeal in *Fretland* found that "work-related injury discrimination is not a normal risk of the compensation bargain" (Ibid.), and held that "*Fretland's* emotional distress claims are not barred by the exclusivity rule to the extent they seek emotional distress damages for the alleged work-related injury discrimination" (Ibid.).

Based on the above judicial decisions, we think that the workers' compensation exclusive remedy rule does not preclude a worker, who is the victim of discrimination in the workplace that violates the FEHA, from pursuing an action for damages for the negligent infliction of emotional distress caused by that discrimination, because discrimination is not a normal risk of employment and violates the legislatively established public policy contained in the FEHA.

As to an employee's ability to collect an award if an employee receives compensation under workers' compensation, and secures a judgment for, or settlement of, civil damages against the employer because of an exemption to the exclusive remedy rule, except for suits against uninsured employers (see Sec. 3709, Lab. C.), there is no requirement in the Labor Code that the compensation paid under

⁵ If the action is filed under the FEHA, a person is required to exhaust his or her administrative remedies, which may include an award to the person by the Fair Employment Housing Commission for damages for emotional injuries as a component of actual damages, before filing a civil action in court (see *Romano v. Rockwell Internat., Inc.*, supra; Sec. 12935; para. (1), subd. (c), Sec. 12965). If the action is filed in court, then a judgment rendered for the person may be issued. For purposes of this opinion, the use of the term "award" means both an award by an administrative agency and a judgment by a court.

workers' compensation is required to be credited against the judgment or settlement, However, in *Shoemaker* v. *Myers*, supra, the California Supreme Court stated that "[i]n the event of any overlap in the recovery of both compensation and damages, the employer must be allowed a credit against the judgment for any compensation already paid on account of an industrial injury arising from the same facts [citations omitted]" (*Shoemaker* v. *Myers*, supra, at p. 23, fn. 12). Thus, we do not think there is any provision of the workers' compensation law that would prevent a worker, who is the victim of discrimination in the workplace, and who is successful in an action for damages for the negligent infliction of emotional distress caused by that discrimination, from collecting any award for those damages. However, if there is a workers' compensation award arising from the same facts, the employer would be allowed a credit against the award in the amount of the workers' compensation award.

In conclusion, based on the above, the workers' compensation exclusive remedy rule does not preclude a worker, who is the victim of discrimination in the workplace that violates the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, from pursuing and collecting an award for damages for the negligent infliction of emotional distress caused by that discrimination.
