Assembly Bill 127, Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2006, includes \$200 Million for the enhancing and expanding of medical school programs. In section 101041, sub section (c), AB127 states:

(c) Of the amount made available under subdivision (a), the amount of two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000) shall be used for capital improvements that expand and enhance medical education programs with an emphasis on telemedicine aimed at developing high-tech approaches to health care.

University of California, Riverside (UCR) has an existing medical program, the UCR/UCLA Thomas Haider Biomed Program. The intent

of this letter is to express my desire that this existing medical program be eligible for the funding made available in AB 127.

<u>The UCR/UCLA Thomas Haider Program in Biomedical Sciences</u>

Working in conjunction with the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, UCR provides a unique path of entrance to one of the country's leading medical schools. The UCR/UCLA Thomas Haider Program in Biomedical Sciences, Riverside County's only medical program, provides UCR students (including transfer students) exclusive access to 24 medical school seats each year.

Applications for these seats are accepted only from UCR students, from any major. Each medical school class size of 24 students allows for close faculty / student interaction and personalized attention.

Students accepted into this prestigious medical school program complete the first two years of their medical education at UCR in an intimate learning environment before moving on to UCLA for their remaining two years. They receive their M.D. degrees from UCLA.

The UCR/UCLA Thomas Haider Program in Biomedical Sciences involves clinical instructors from within the base of community physicians in the Riverside areas. The program is affiliated with several local hospitals and medical centers, but there is no ownership of any medical group or hospital. More than 80 physicians have joined UCR as clinical faculty.

UCR is in the process of submitting plans for their medical school, and their inclusion in the \$200 Million for the enhancing and expanding of medical school programs would be a much needed benefit to them as they continue in that endeavor.

As an essential part of the working staff of a preschool setting, these papaprofessionals are intended to benefit from the staff development resources funded in this year's budget.

This letter is to clarify the author's intent of AB 573 relating to design professionals' indemnity promises in contracts with local public agencies for design services.

It is my understanding that there are two issues that need clarification. The first issue questions the bill's impact on design-build contracts between local public agencies and design-build entities. AB 573 applies only to indemnity promises by design professionals to local public agencies. Therefore, if the design-build contract contains an indemnity promise by a building contractor running in favor of the local public agency, AB 573 would not apply to that indemnity promise.

The other issue that needs clarification relates to insurance coverage in effect prior to the enactment of the bill. AB 573 only applies to indemnity promises, not insurance coverage. Nothing in AB 573 interferes with or supersedes any existing insurance policy, even if the policy indemnifies design professionals for their services. The bill clearly states that it only applies to a contract for design professional services entered into on or after January 1, 2007. In other words, the bill only applies prospectively.

I trust that this clarifies the questions that have arisen.

Please print this letter in the Assembly Daily Journal. It clarifies the legislative intent regarding my Assembly Bill 1302, which amends the Administrative Procedure Act.

AB 1302 modifies language that determines when a state agency may adopt emergency regulations. Because emergency regulations restrict

public notice and participation, they should be permitted only in limited circumstances. Under current law emergency regulations are permitted when they are "necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety or general welfare." AB 1302 would modify this to say that emergency regulations are permitted to respond to "a situation that calls for immediate action to avoid serious harm to the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare." This standard clarifies and augments the demonstration that a state agency must make to justify the use of emergency regulations.

Although AB 1302 alters what an agency must demonstrate to justify the use of emergency regulations, I believe that it does not restrict the types of threats that may be addressed by emergency regulation. It should not restrict the government's ability to use emergency regulations to address environmental, economic or any other particular category of threat requiring an immediate response. Under AB 1302, emergency regulations may be used by a state agency in response to any "situation that calls for immediate action to avoid serious harm to the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare".

Finally, AB 1302 is not intended to modify how the term "public" should be interpreted in evaluating the phrase "public peace, health, safety, or general welfare". Nor was it my intent to modify any judicial opinion which has previously evaluated issues regarding the adoption of emergency regulations.

I want to emphasize the importance of assuring that any common system for data collection and reporting requirements recommended by the working group not impede any district, college or program from receiving federal funds.

Currently, school districts that operate adult education programs are required to collect data in very specific ways as a part of Federal requirements under the Perkins Act. The Superintendent, the Chancellor and the working group should fully consider the impacts of federal data

collection requirements before making any recommendations to the Legislature. The recommendations should not risk the loss of federal funds nor should they suggest additional and duplicative data collection requirements.

AB 1881 makes numerous changes to existing law regarding landscape water conservation. One provision in the bill requires the Department of Water Resources to update the model local water efficient landscape ordinance, and requires local cities and counties to either adopt the updated model ordinance or an ordinance that is at least as effective in conserving water as the updated model ordinance.

AB 1881 primarily addresses city and county efforts to promote landscape water conservation. Concerns were raised regarding the potential conflict between city and county conservation programs and public water system conservation programs operating in the same jurisdiction. Specifically, a concern was raised that language in AB 1881 (Section 65595(e) of the Government Code) may be interpreted to require a city or county to adopt a provision of the model ordinance in conflict with a public water system program. Therefore, AB 1881 was amended to clarify that the bill does not require a city or county ordinance to be in conflict with a public water system conservation program.

It is my hope that cities and counties can coordinate with public water systems when potential conflicts arise, though it is important to understand that Section 65595(e) was not intended to preclude conflict.

As a matter of background, over the past 38 years, the Legislature has established a wide variety of agricultural commissions, which have various authorized activities including research and promotion of California commodities.

Under current law, an individual commission may request the Secretary of Agriculture to adopt and administer programs under the 1937 Marketing Act. Doing so would trigger a vote of the affected assessment payers in that industry. This bill would allow a commission to request the Secretary to administer programs that are both under the 1937 Act and the commission's statute, which the affected assessment payers of that commodity have already approved. The bill ensures that

there will be a hearing on any petition filed and that the default course of action is a vote of the affected assessment payers. The narrow exception to a vote exists when the Secretary concludes that there is no substantial question of opposition to the petition.

There has been some question about ambiguity in the phrase "no substantial question of opposition." A definition was adopted to provide greater clarity as to this trigger for a vote of affected assessment payers. As the definition provides, the phrase is intended to mean that if the Secretary determines that there is opposition to the substance of the petition, he or she would send the issue to a referendum vote. The goal of this language was to provide the Secretary with the flexibility to ensure that the opposition is to the petition request, not the underlying commodity commission.

I believe that AB 2354 strikes the proper balance between protecting the interests of assessment payers and ensuring that commissions operate consistent with decisional law.

Mr. Speaker: The purpose of this letter is to clarify the intent of my AB 2593, which addresses a specific problem for drivers and employers of drivers in the transportation industry regarding when the meal period required by Section 512 of the Labor Code must commence. If enacted, this bill would allow certain collective bargaining agreements in the transportation industry to govern the commencement of the required meal period.

The bill is intended only to address this one narrow aspect of the law governing meal periods. The enactment of AB 2593 should <u>not</u> be used to interpret how the pre-existing law related to meal periods can be applied to other industries or situations, as clearly expressed in Section 2 of the bill:

SEC.2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Section 512.7 shall not be construed to affect the nature or scope of the law related to meal periods, including but not limited to the timing of commencement of the meal period, other than for employees or employers specifically covered by Section 512.7."

The purpose of this statement in Section 2 is to clarify that the bill does not address the issue of what authority, if any, administrative agencies have with regard to the regulation of meal periods, and that no inference should be drawn from the bill's passage with respect to such authority. Section 2 also clarifies that this bill will not effect, nor should any inference be drawn regarding, the application of the law governing meal periods to any group of employees other than commercial drivers in the transportation industry covered by a collective bargaining agreement.

Mr. Speaker: I wish to clarify the intent of subdivision (g) of Section 1569.69 of the Health and Safety Code, as added by Assembly Bill No. 2609. The bill increases training requirements in medication management for staff in residential care facilities for the elderly who assist residents with self-administration of medication.

Subdivision (g) requires that facilities providing care for 16 or more persons shall maintain documentation that demonstrates that a consultant pharmacist or nurse has reviewed the facility's medication management program and procedures at least twice per year. This is designed to establish the means of verifying that the reviews have been conducted. While the bill contemplates that facilities will conduct such reviews and maintain accurate documentation of them, there is no expectation that the Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) of the Department of Social Services (DSS) evaluate the contents or merits of reviews performed by pharmacists or nurses. The August 9 amendments to the bill added the phrase "shall maintain documentation that demonstrates" to subdivision (g). This language was added in response to concerns expressed by DSS that the prior version of the bill

imposed a duty upon CCLD when conducting a compliance review to examine the validity of the medication management review performed by a consultant pharmacist or nurse, a function that CCLD staff is not qualified to perform.

Dear Mr. Wilson: Assembly Bill 2886 creates multiple provisions dealing with identity theft, identity theft trafficking and mail theft. However, there were unintentional, technical errors in the drafting of the language which merit clarification.

The purpose of the amendments in the bill (as amended August 29, 2006) to subdivision (d) of Section 530.5 of the Penal Code is to define two new alternate-felony misdemeanors applicable to persons who sell, transfer or convey the personal identifying information of other persons. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (d) concerns a person who, with intent to defraud, sells, transfers, or conveys the personal identifying information of another person. Paragraph (2) concerns a person who, knowing that the personal identifying information of a specific person will be used to commit a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 530.5, sells, transfers or conveys the other person's personal identifying information.

Because of a drafting error in the last set of amendments (August 28, 2006), the description of the alternate felony-misdemeanor in paragraph (1) of subdivision (d) is different than the description in paragraph (2) of the subdivision. In particular, a specific reference to the alternative of a sentence to the county jail was inadvertently omitted in paragraph (2). The bill is not intended to create a substantive difference in the penalties applicable to a conviction for the crime defined in paragraph (1) of subdivision (d) as compared to the crime defined in paragraph (2).

Penal Code Section 18 states that where an offense is punishable by a fine or a sentence to prison, the crime "may be punishable by imprisonment in the county jail or by a fine, or by both." This is essentially the penalty prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) of Section 530.5, as amended by AB 2886. By operation of law, and consistent with the intent and purpose of AB 2886, paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) of Penal Code Section 530.5, as amended by AB 2886, defines an alternate felony-misdemeanor.

Additionally, due to a drafting mistake, the erroneous United States Code (USC) Section number was referenced in subdivision (e) of Penal Code Section 530.5. As the bill stands, Section 1705 of Title 18 of the USC, a federal law pertaining to the "destruction of letter boxes or mail", is cited. However, the language of subdivision (e) in AB 2886 is intended to focus on "every person who commits mail theft", which does not coincide with the context of the section referenced in the bill. I want to be explicitly clear that Section 1708 of Title 18 of the United States Code, which deals with the "theft or receipt of stolen mail", is the section originally meant to be cited in the bill. The provision dealing with mail theft in AB 2886 was written to apply to the theft of mail, not the damaging of mailboxes or mail receptacles.

This measure is meant to aid in the combating the rising epidemic of identity theft and mail theft.

It is my intent that any funds provided by Health and Safety Code Section 38597 are to be used solely for the direct costs incurred in administering this division. This intent is further demonstrated by the fact that Section 38597 is contained within Part 7 of the bill which relates to the California Air Resources Board's administrative functions.

Dear Dotson: I am submitting this letter to the Assembly Journal to clarify my intent in introducing AB 3014.

AB 3014 defines the term "Asian Massage" as it appears in Section 4937 of the Business and Professions Code as "the use of pressure techniques, including myofascial release or manual therapy, as it relates to soft tissues, through massage and mobilization of skin and muscle for the therapeutic purpose of proper body function."

It is not my intent that AB 3014 would open the door for just anyone to be authorized to practice some fashion of massage under the aegis of Acupuncture/Oriental or Asian Massage. Nor is it my intent that the provisions of this bill would apply to brothels which mislead the public by advertising their services as "Oriental or Asian massage."

Rather, my intent is to address reimbursement of services to providers and consumers who can already provide services under current law. No language proposed by this bill changes or modifies the stringent requirements already in place regarding the scope of practice, licensing or education of acupuncturists in California.
