Dear Mr. Wilson: This letter is to clarify one provision of AB 759. In general, this bill provides clarification to California's contract ban law. AB 759 makes it clear that the ban should not include legitimate cross-border mergers which are common in today's global business environment.

Section 10286.1(b)(2)(A) provides that parties to legitimate cross-border mergers may compete for state contracts. Section 10286.1(b)(2)(B) provides that a successor corporation of a party to a legitimate cross-border merger may also compete for state contracts. The term "successor corporation" is intended to include any foreign entity spun-off from a party to a legitimate cross-border merger so long as such spun-off entity is a treaty resident of the foreign country under whose laws it is organized and such treaty is a comprehensive income tax treaty. If that is the case, then such a spun-off entity may compete for state contracts.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 827

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully submit this letter to be printed in the Assembly Journal in order to provide clarification regarding Assembly Bill 827.

Assembly Bill 827 aims to prohibit a local agency's contract executed or renewed on or after January 1, 2011 with an "excluded employee" from containing: an automatic contract renewal, an automatic compensation increase that exceeds a cost-of-living adjustment, an automatic compensation increase that is linked to a third-party contract, including agreements under the Meyers-Milias-Brown Act or the Education Code's employee relations provisions, or severance payment greater than the amount allowed by current law.

Additionally, the measure requires local agencies to complete a performance review before it can increase the compensation of an "excluded employee." This requirement does not apply to cost-of-living adjustments. The records, procedures, and actions must follow current law, including the Brown Act and the Public Records Act.

As the author, I intend for the bill to only capture one group of excluded employees: those persons who are or will be employed by, and report directly to, a local agency's legislative body and is not subject to the Meyers-Milias-Brown Act or the Education Code's employee relation provision. Specifically local professional leaders—city managers, county executives, special district managers, school superintendents, community college district chancellors and superintendent/presidents of single college districts—must follow the contract provisions in Assembly Bill 827 and have a performance review conducted before their employers give raises and expand benefits. The bill in no way includes employees who do not report directly to the legislative body of a local agency.

Thus, it is my intent that the sentence on page 4, lines 4 to 7, inclusive, of the August 27, 2010 version of the bill be understood as an explanation—and not separate from—the bill's definition of "excluded employee."

Due to a drafting error, the term "filer" appears on page 3, lines 24 and 28, when the more accurate term should have been "excluded employee." When those terms are read in isolation, some observers might be confused. However, when read within context, it is clear that the bill applies to "excluded employees." As such a minor clarification may be useful in 2011 and I would encourage a legislative fix be pursued as part of the 2011 Senate Local Government Omnibus bill. As the bill's author, I know that there is no confusion in my mind and in the collective action taken by my legislative colleagues when they passed Assembly Bill 827.

AB 1106 specifically allows the California Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (CEC) to contract with the Financial Development Corporations (FDC's) to assist in expending funds via the loan guarantee component of the California Alternative and Renewable Fuel, Vehicle Technology, Clean Air and Carbon Reduction Act of 2007 (Section 44272 Health and Safety Code).

The authority to enter into contracts with FDC's provided by the amendment to subdivision (f) of Section 44272 of the Health and Safety Code should be interpreted to mean that all costs of administering the funds through the Business, Transportation and Housing Agency's program implemented by the FDC's shall be covered in the contract.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1723

Dear Mr. Wilson: I have authored AB 1723 to permit the introduction of hearsay into evidence if the party seeking to introduce the statement can establish by a preponderance of the evidence that the other party has engaged or aided and abetted in wrongdoing that was intended to, and did, procure the unavailability of the declarant of the hearsay.

I believe that the creation of the forfeiture by wrongdoing hearsay exception as presently defined in AB 1723 will help relieve the continuing problem of witness intimidation in our criminal justice system. However, in its present version, the exception is significantly more restrictive than the analogous exception in the federal system and the exception as it exists in 20 other jurisdictions. We anticipate the additional restrictions that have been placed on the exception via amendments to the original version may substantially diminish the potential utility of the exception. Given this concern and the fact that the bill contains a sunset provision, if, over the five-year life span of the measure, it appears the exception is not being used and/or not having

any significant impact, it is our intent to return to the Legislature prior to the sunset date to seek revisions that parallel the constitutionally-sound hearsay exception as it exists in the federal system, and in almost every other state that has an analogous hearsay exception, and where the exception has been used to help ensure true and just verdicts without any drawbacks or negative consequences.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 2092

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully request that this letter be entered into the Assembly Daily Journal to provide further clarification of my intent in authoring AB 2092.

AB 2092 requires the Delta Stewardship Council (Council) to develop a long term finance plan by 2013 to support implementation of the Delta Plan. Prior to the establishment or collection of a long-term revenue source the bill authorizes the Council to seek early funding contributions for the purposes of funding the Council's planning and administrative costs related to the development of the Delta Plan. The bill also requires the Council to provide credit for those contributions against future funding requirements.

The Schwarzenegger Administration has proposed a spending plan for FY 2010/11 and 2011/12 which consists of a combination of funding from the General Fund, existing bond funds and federal funds to support the development of the Delta Plan and Finance Plan. It is my intent in AB 2092 that early funding contributions be used only as a fallback source of funding if the public funds currently budgeted prove to be inadequate. It is also my intent that early contributions provided by beneficiaries would not prejudice or provide undue advantage to those contributors. Dear Mr. Wilson: The purpose of this letter is to clarify the legislative intent of Assembly Bill 2147, which was introduced to improve the participation of rural and low-income communities in California's Safe Routes to School Program. Enacted in 1999, the California Safe Routes to School program seeks to increase the number of children who walk or bicycle to school by funding projects that remove existing barriers. These barriers include lack of infrastructure, unsafe infrastructure and a shortage of programs that promote walking and bicycling. Funding for Safe Routes to School is administered through CalTrans to local government agencies based on a statewide competition.

Among the provisions in the bill, AB 2147 provides the necessary changes in statute to ensure that low-income schools are effectively served by this program. Specifically, the intent of Section 2, subsection (b) is to allow school districts to apply for funding. This is consistent with the federal Safe Routes to School program, whereby non-traditional applicants, such as school districts, work with local governments to develop the necessary partnerships prior to submitting their applications. However, Section 2, subsection (b) should not be interpreted as authorizing CalTrans to require a local government agency to serve as the lead agency on a project for which they have not willingly agreed to be a partner, prior to the application being submitted to the department. Rather, it is the intent of the provision that, should CalTrans receive an application from a school district that has not consulted in advance with the city or county of the proposed project, CalTrans will return the application and request that the school coordinate with the relevant city or county.

It is my intent, should this bill be signed into law, to continue to work with CalTrans to insure the appropriate implementation.

Dear Speaker Pérez: I respectfully request to publish this letter of legislative intent in the Assembly Daily Journal relative to my AB 2151.

Under current law, a peace officer, member of the California Highway Patrol or a firefighter is not required to report to his or her private automobile insurance provider any accident in which they were involved while operating an authorized emergency vehicle or any employer-leased or employer-rented vehicle in the performance of their duty, during the hours of their employment.

For the purposes of AB 2151, it is my intent that the bill's provisions be construed to apply to the aforementioned public safety personnel when using a personal vehicle as a result of a specific request of or direction by his or her employer, rather than the use of a personal vehicle for the purposes of reporting to his or her regularly assigned worksite.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The purpose of this letter is to clarify the intent of specific provisions of Assembly Bill 2212, which adds Section 709 to the Welfare and Institutions Code.

AB 2212 is the result of extensive collaboration with representatives of the courts, prosecuting agencies, public defenders, and youth advocates. Although highly technical and nuanced, the resulting language in the bill is a synthesis of stakeholders' interests.

After AB 2212 passed out off of the Senate floor, and was while it was pending concurrence in Senate amendments on the Assembly floor, the Governor's office notified my office that there was a concern that a finding of incompetence pursuant to AB 2212 might trigger state mental health services that would otherwise require a separate proceeding. Instead of attempting to rescind the Senate action and having the bill returned to the Senate for amendments, we elected to submit this letter to clarify our intent, and explain why amendments are unnecessary.

AB 2212 is intentionally narrowly tailored to solely clarify the standard for a court to employ in determining whether or not to declare a doubt as to a minor's competency to stand trial when that minor is

before the court within the court's jurisdiction pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 601 or 602. Our intent is for AB 2212 to simply clarify the standard for when the court should declare a doubt as to the minor's competency, and if such a doubt is declared, clarify that the court must suspend proceedings, as specified. It is not our intent to affect what happens with the minor once a doubt has been declared. We intentionally did not address any actions of the court after the declaration of a doubt. Our intent is for AB 2212 to default to existing law on these matters.

This letter is intended to clarify the functional relationship between the California Technology Agency and the Department of General Services as it relates to information technology procurement.

The Department of General Services, as the State's centralized business services agency, retains all authority for conducting and managing the procurement of goods and services, including information technology goods and services. This bill additionally authorizes the California Technology Agency, to establish information technology procurement policies specific to what is to be purchased and by whom within any agency or department.

The Legislature has long recognized the importance of creating a separation between those who conduct and manage the procurement process and those who develop the standards and criteria for information technology purchases. This bill maintains this division of responsibilities and is essential to ensuring the efficient and accountable use of the taxpayers' money.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully request this letter regarding my Assembly Bill No. 2432 relative to prepackaged, nonpotentially hazardous foods, be submitted to the Assembly Journal.

A concern has arisen with respect to the meaning of a "permanent food facility" as defined in Section 114266 of the California Health and Safety Code, which requires food facilities to be fully enclosed in a building consisting of permanent floors, walls, and an overhead structure that meets the minimum standards as prescribed by the code. At issue is whether a retailer operating from a building that otherwise fits this definition, but also utilizes roll up doors, is considered to be fully enclosed, and thus, should be considered as such for the purposes of implementation of AB 2432.

According to the state's local environmental health directors who conduct the retail food facility inspections in the State of California, a food facility that utilizes roll up doors is, in fact, considered to be a fully enclosed, permanent food facility as defined in Section 114266. Furthermore, it is the intent of AB 2432 for a permanent food facility that utilizes roll up doors to be considered fully enclosed and consistent with Section 114266 for the purposes of implementation of this bill.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully submit this letter in an effort to address the context of my Assembly Bill 2446.

AB 2446 provides high school students the option of completing a course in career technical education to fulfill an existing high school graduation requirement. This bill does not mandate school districts or county offices of education to offer career technical education as a course option if they currently do not offer career technical education courses. If a school district or county office of education that does not currently offer career technical education courses wish to add career technical education courses, school districts or county offices of education must fund these courses within existing resources and are prohibited from requiring supplemental reimbursement from the state.

The legislative intent of the provisions of this bill is to contain any general fund costs. The provisions are not local mandates that require reimbursement from the state for additional career technical education courses pursuant to the provisions of this bill. AB 2446 is considerate of the state's current fiscal situation and this bill is a modest attempt of providing students with more course options without adding a new local mandate to districts.

Dear Chief Clerk Wilson: Assembly Bill 471 was originally conceived as a measure that would clarify ambiguities in existing law to ensure that state agencies may hire in-house legal counsel to provide legal advice, without the prior approval of the Attorney General. The bill would have preserved the presumption that the Attorney General is responsible for representing state officers and agencies in civil litigation before courts and administrative bodies, and would have provided agencies and the Attorney General the flexibility to make other arrangements when needed.

Ironically, these provisions, designed to protect the functions of in-house agency counsel were vigorously opposed by them. The bill also would have preserved the Attorney General's role in superintending the hiring of private counsel by state agencies for any purpose. This is an important check that must be maintained in the law, as members of both parties have recognized. In the face of opposition to the bill from the Administration, I have amended AB 471. However, I urge this body

to move similar legislation again next year to address this ambiguity in the law.

The bill now addresses vestigial gender bias in provisions governing the Attorney General's authority.

33427.3. An agency may provide job training, job placement, apprenticeship, and pre-apprenticeship programs relating to construction or to operations of businesses within project areas.

AB 2531 does not suspend the provisions of the California Labor Code regarding apprenticeship, so apprenticeship programs supplying workers to public projects still require approval from the Division of Apprenticeship Standards, and a redevelopment agency would have to work through state-approved apprenticeship programs when promoting apprenticeship within project areas. It is not the intent of AB 2531 to undermine the State's regulation of apprenticeship programs.

Dear Mr. Wilson: It has been asserted that my legislation, AB 2554, is an attempt to avoid the voter approval requirement for property-related fees that was imposed by Proposition 218 of 1996 (now Article XIII D of the California Constitution). That assertion is unfounded because no statute, including this bill, can contravene the provisions of Article XIII D. More significantly, there is no provision in the bill that attempts to modify, re-define, or clarify any provision of Article XIII D, which would be necessary if the intent of my legislation was truly to skirt the applicable voter approval requirement of Article XIII D.

The misrepresentation about AB 2554 attempting to avoid the appropriate Proposition 218 vote requirement is being used as an attempt to justify a demand for an amendment which would incorporate a reference to voter or property owner approval into the bill. Given the fact that the current version of AB 2554 already conditions the fee upon all of the applicable provisions of Article XIII D including Section 6 (c),

which establishes the requirements for voter approval of property-related fees, these arguments seem to be an attempt to elevate an appellate court case to the level of statutory law. The status of that appellate case is not the subject of this bill. Therefore, that issue should be pursued in separate legislation, and it should rise or fall on its own merits.

AB 2554 is quite narrow. It authorizes the Los Angeles County Flood Control District to "... impose a fee or charge, in compliance with the applicable provisions of Article XIII D of the California Constitution". The explicit reference to Article XIII D was added to the bill specifically by the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, the bill's sponsor, and me because we understand the sensitivity surrounding vote requirements and we wanted to assure all interested parties that the District will comply with all applicable voter approval requirements in Article XIII D.

It is, and always has been, the intent of the District to submit the fee authorized in AB 2554 for voter approval in accordance with Article XIII D, and I believe that is clear in the language of the bill.
