Dear Mr. Wilson: I am writing to clarify the wording of one sentence of my bill, AB 748. In Government Code 6254(f)(4)(B)(iii), the bill inadvertently states that a law enforcement agency would "provide the video or audio recording" if the agency determines that disclosure would substantially interfere with the investigation.

This part of the bill is intended to mirror Government Code 6254(f)(4)(A)(ii) added in an earlier section of the bill. As such, the following phrase—"the estimated date for the disclosure of"—was unintentionally omitted from this subparagraph and should instead be drafted accordingly:

If disclosure pursuant to clause (ii) would substantially interfere with an active criminal or administrative investigation, the agency shall provide in writing to the requester the specific basis for the agency's determination that disclosure would substantially interfere with the investigation, and provide the estimated date for the disclosure of the video or audio recording. Thereafter, the recording may be withheld by the agency for 45 calendar days, subject to extensions as set forth in clause (ii) of subparagraph (A).

Our intention in Government Code 6254(f)(4)(B)(iii) is to state that the agency would be able to withhold the recording if the disclosure would substantially interfere with an investigation, and that the agency shall provide the estimated date for the disclosure of the video or audio recording. Reading through the narrative of the bill, especially in the

context of the Public Records Act, it is otherwise very clear that the intent is not to require disclosure of footage in instances when doing so would interfere with an investigation.

I commit to immediately introduce clean-up urgency legislation this year when the legislature reconvenes, and before AB 748 takes effect on July 1, 2019, which would reflect the specific changes described in this letter. This clarification will provide flexibility for law enforcement agencies while protecting the public's right to transparency in order to fully realize the intent of AB 748.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The purpose of this letter is to clarify the intent of AB 829, which I introduced in response to concerns about the City of Los Angeles' practice of requiring an affordable housing developer to obtain, prior to consideration for an award of any funding for an affordable housing project, a "letter of acknowledgment" from the city council member in whose district the proposed project would be located.

AB 829 would prohibit state funds, including an allocation of low-income housing tax credits, from being awarded to, utilized in, or made available for any projects that are subject to a letter of acknowledgment requirement.

The intent of this bill is to apply this prohibition to a project that is first subject to a letter of acknowledgement requirement after the bill's effective date of January 1, 2019. It would be contrary to the intent of this bill for the prohibition to apply to affordable housing projects that successfully began moving through the local approvals process and were subject to the requirement prior to January 1, 2019, but that will be receiving funding in 2019 or beyond.

Given the magnitude of the state's affordable housing and homelessness crisis, this legislation is designed to reduce barriers to building affordable housing. It is not intended to stop critically needed affordable housing projects that started moving through the local approvals process prior to the effective date of the bill.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I authored Assembly Bill 1214 this year, relating to juvenile competency proceedings. I submit this letter to the Assembly Journal for the purpose of clarifying the intent of this measure.

It is not my view that Section 709 (b) (9) (A) or Section 709 (g) (1) (A) of the Welfare & Institutions Code would authorize the admission of minors to developmental centers or to state-operated community facilities. In 2012, there was a statutory moratorium placed on developmental center admissions, and there are currently no provisions for the admission of a minor to a developmental center or to a state-operated community facility.

I plan to author an Assembly Bill with an urgency clause in the next legislative session to amend the language of Section 709 of the Welfare & Institutions Code to strike Section 709 (b) (9) (A) and Section 709 (g) (1) (A). My intention when authoring this bill will be to clarify that Developmental Centers are not a potential placement option for juveniles with developmental disabilities determined to be incompetent.

Dear Mr. Wilson: AB 1793 creates an easier pathway for people with cannabis-related convictions changed by Proposition 64: The Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act—which was approved by 57 percent of California voters in November 2016—to reduce or remove eligible convictions from their records. AB 1793 will offer hundreds of thousands of people negatively impacted by the war on drugs a chance to reclaim their lives.

I respectfully submit this letter to be printed in the Assembly Journal to provide clarification on my intent of AB 1793, specifically with respect to the Courts and their timeframe to modify all eligible records. AB 1793 requires the State Department of Justice to review its records in the state database to identify past cannabis convictions potentially eligible for resentencing or reclassification under Proposition 64 and to notify the prosecution of all cases eligible within their jurisdiction by July 1, 2019. The prosecution will have until July 1, 2020 to review and determine whether to challenge the resentencing or reclassification if they determine the person does not meet the established criteria or, in

the case of resentencing, presents an unreasonable risk to public safety. If there is no challenge, AB 1793 requires the Courts to resentence or reclassify the conviction.

It is not the intent of my legislation to apply the July 1, 2020 deadline to the Courts. AB 1793 does not have a timeline set forth in the bill for when the Courts are required to modify eligible records. It is my intent to establish an appropriate and realistic timeline for the Courts in follow up legislation next year.

Dear Mr. Wilson: As the author of Assembly Bill 1944, I am requesting that my statement clarifying the intent of the bill as it relates to certain pending litigation be included in the Assembly Daily journal. Assembly Bill 1944 delineates groundwater subbasins within the San Luis Rey Valley Basin and designates both subbasins, for the purposes of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA), as medium priority basins, and authorizes water beneath the surface of the ground within the newly-defined Upper San Luis Rey Valley Groundwater Subbasin to be included within the definition of groundwater for the purposes of SGMA for any groundwater

sustainability agency developing or implementing a groundwater sustainability plan.

The bill also provides an affirmative declaration that it does not alter any water right or the priority of any water right under state or federal law, or alter the status under SGMA of water extracted and used under existing appropriative water right within the Lower and Upper San Luis Rey Valley Groundwater Subbasins downstream of the confluence of the San Luis Rey River and Frey Creek.

It was my intent in expressly limiting the application of the bill to the San Luis Rey Valley Basin to facilitate and aid in the implementation and application of SGMA, nothing in the bill is intended to, or affects the consideration or determination of any claim or defense asserted in the matter of *City of Carlsbad and Carlsbad Municipal Water District v. California State Water Resources Control Board (County of Los Angeles, Case No. BC545736)*, or in any related proceeding.

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully submit this Letter to the Journal to clarify the legislative intent of my AB 2061, passed by this body in 2018. AB 2061 amended section 35551 of the Vehicle Code. Section 35551(f)(3) states in part: "This subdivision applies only to the extent expressly authorized by federal law."

The intent of this section was to ensure federal funding would not be jeopardized by allowing weight limits beyond what are allowed under federal law on the Federal Interstate Highway System, while still allowing vehicles to receive the weight exemption granted under this bill on state highways and local roads.

For example, federal law currently allows natural gas vehicles to have a weight exemption up to 2,000 pounds on the Federal Interstate Highway System, but not other near-zero or zero-emissions vehicles. At the time this bill was being heard, Congress was considering extending the federal exemption for natural gas vehicles to also include electric vehicles. This bill would allow both electric vehicles and natural gas vehicles to exceed weight limits on local streets and highways, while only allowing electric vehicles in excess of 80,000 pounds to go on the Federal Interstate Highway System if Congress expressly allowed it.

RE: AB 2107 (Reyes)—New Motor Vehicle Board

Dear Mr. Wilson: My Assembly Bill 2107 seeks to update the laws regulating the relationship between automobile manufacturers and franchised dealers. Two questions were brought to my attention and I would like to clarify my intention.

Section 3050 of the Vehicle Code contains the powers and duties of the Board and subdivision (b) relates to "petitions" in which the Board can "[c]onsider any matter concerning the activities or practices of any person applying for, or holding a license as, a new motor vehicle dealer, manufacturer, manufacturer branch, distributor, distributor branch, or representative pursuant to Chapter 4 (commencing with Section 11700) of Division 5 submitted by any person . . ."

AB 2107 amends Vehicle Code Section 3050 to remove the authority at the New Motor Vehicle Board ("Board) to hear appeals from decisions made by the Department of Motor Vehicles. AB 2107 also seeks to clarify the Board's jurisdiction over consumers in subdivision (b)(2)(B) of Section 3050. It is my intention that, for the Board to have jurisdiction over a petition pursuant to this subdivision, the petitioner must have filed the petition or consent to the jurisdiction by the Board. Since this subdivision is limited to petitions filed by members of the public, including consumers, it is my intention that this subdivision does not affect petitions filed by licensees nor does it affect respondents.

Section 3065 of the Vehicle Code addresses the warranty reimbursement requirements between franchisor automakers and their franchised dealers. AB 2107 amends this section to specify that dealers are entitled to retail warranty reimbursement rates for labor and parts if the dealer complies with Section 3065.2 of the Vehicle Code, a newly established section. AB 2107 also specifies that an automaker and a dealer may enter into any voluntary written agreement signed by both parties that adequately and fairly compensates the dealer for labor and parts used to satisfy the warranty obligations. It is my intention to provide franchised dealers with an option on warranty reimbursement rates. A franchisee might choose to pursue warranty reimbursement with the retail submission process established in Section 3065.2 or sign a separate written agreement with an automaker. It is not my intention to compel every franchisee to use the retail warranty reimbursement rates nor should the bill operate to default to this retail warranty reimbursement rates option as established in Section 3065.2 of the Vehicle Code.

AB 2911 adds Section 4295.5 to the Public Resources Code. Section 4295.5(a) provides access and streamlines the process for persons who own, control, operate, or maintain electrical transmission or distribution lines to perform any vegetation management work required by law. Section 4295.5(b) states that nothing in Section 4295.5(a) exempts a person from liability for any damage caused when performing such work.

Section 4295.5(b) is intended only to confirm that Section 4295.5(a) does not change current law with respect to liability for damages resulting from work performed outside an electrical transmission or distribution line easement. Nothing in Section 4295.5(b) should be interpreted to limit the authority granted in Section 4295 (a) or impose any new or different liability on a person who owns, controls, operates, or maintains any electrical transmission or distribution line.
