**Diane Boyer-Vine
Legislative Counsel of California**

For more than a century, the Office of Legislative Counsel has assisted the Legislature and Governor by providing nonpartisan legal services relating to the legislative process. So much of the work here in the Capitol involves or must flow through the Office of Legislative Counsel.

Legislators are most familiar with Legislative Counsel's work in drafting and amending bills, constitutional amendments, and resolutions. Ms. Boyer-Vine and her deputies also render legal opinions on issues of constitutionality, statutory interpretation, and other legal matters.

Diane Boyer-Vine also oversees the Legislative Data Center, which provides essential technological services to both houses, and her staff ensures the security and accuracy of our electronic voting system here on the Assembly Floor.

To pay tribute to Diane Boyer-Vine, a video was presented to the assemblage highlighting significant moments in her distinguished 18-year career as the 10th, and 1st woman, to serve as Legislative Counsel of California.

Dear Mrs. Parker: As the author of AB 3312, I write to clarify the intent of the bill and address questions that have recently arisen about the provisions contained in Government Code Section 56748(c).

AB 3312 grants the City of Merced a limited exemption from the contiguousness requirement in Government Code Section 56741 to annex the University of California, Merced campus and territory contiguous to the campus. Once the campus has been annexed pursuant to Section 56748(b), Section 56748(c) then prohibits the Merced Local Agency Formation Commission from approving any subsequent annexation of territory which is solely contiguous to the city due to its proximity to the road strip created by Section 56748(a)(3).

Section 56748(c) disallows a territory to be eligible for annexation under Section 56741 if it is solely contiguous to the city because it is contiguous to the road strip. A territory that is both contiguous to the City of Merced and the road strip may be eligible for annexation under Section 56741.

AB 3312 is not intended to restrict the lawful ability of the City of Merced to annex territory under the 10 Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 so long as the contiguousness requirement created by Section 56741 is not solely fulfilled by a territory's proximity to the road strip created under AB 3312.

I trust this explanation clarifies the questions that have arisen.

Dear Ms. Parker: As the author of AB 1185, I respectfully submit this letter to be printed in the Assembly Journal in order to provide clarification for the intent of the bill, as it relates to the supervisory authority of a County Board of Supervisors.

County sheriffs are the lead agencies of law enforcement officers that are vested with extraordinary authority, and the powers to detain, search, arrest, and use deadly force. Misuse of these authorities can lead—and has led—to grave constitutional violations, harms to liberty and the inherent sanctity of human life, and significant public unrest. Meaningful independent oversight and monitoring of sheriffs' departments is therefore of the utmost importance, as it increases government accountability and transparency, enhances public safety, and builds community trust in law enforcement.

AB 1185 is an important, clarifying measure which would reaffirm that a County Board of Supervisors may establish a Sheriff Oversight Board or an Office of Inspector General to review the actions of that County's Sheriff. It would also clarify that the Board and Inspector General have subpoena power, ensuring that all counties are equally able to exercise oversight over its Sheriff Department.

California law clearly states that Boards of Supervisors have the authority and responsibility to supervise the official conduct of all county officers to ensure they faithfully perform their duties (California Gov. Code § 25303). The California Supreme Court has further determined that Gov. Code § 25303 is inclusive of Sheriffs, as a county and its Board of Supervisors have a vested interest in how a Sheriff performs their investigative duties (*Streit v. County of Los Angeles*, 236 F.3d 552 (9th Cir. 2001) & *Brewster v. Shasta County*, 275 F.3d 803, 810 (9th Cir. 2001)).

The intent of this measure and its reference to Gov. Code § 25303 is to corroborate the interpretation of existing statute and therefore to grant County Boards of Supervisors supervisory authority over all county officers, including the Sheriff.

Dear Mrs. Parker: I authored Assembly Bill 1196 on use of force. As the author, it is my intent to address the ongoing issue of police brutality, racial bias, and the high profile deaths of civilians at the hands of law enforcement. I believe AB 1196 creates a uniform statewide policy banning the use of the chokeholds and carotid restraints by law enforcement.

These dangerous holds are meant to subdue a suspect with “less lethal” force and quickly render them unconscious, but even the slightest error can result in serious injury or death. Simply maintaining these restraints for a minute after a suspect is rendered unconscious can cause permanent brain damage.

It is the intent of the author to change current policy in the state to avoid the types of situations that led to the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, Eric Garner in New York, and the late Fermin Vincent Valenzuela who was killed in 2016 by officers using a carotid restraint in Anaheim, CA.

This bill is designed to promote trust in law enforcement and safe interactions between Californians and the officers entrusted with overseeing their communities. It is not the intent of AB 1196 or the author to take away the general right to self-defense or defense of others against great bodily injury or death, which is available to all people, including law enforcement officers.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 2257

Dear Ms. Parker: I am writing to clarify the intent of AB 2257. The fundamental purpose of AB 2257 is to clarify the application of the California Supreme Court's unanimous decision in *Dynamex Operations West, Inc. v. Superior Court of Los Angeles* (2018) 4 Cal.5th 903 (*Dynamex*) and AB 5 (Chapter 296, Statutes of 2019) in state law. AB 2257 recasts the provisions of AB 5 and provides that, for specified occupations and relationships, the applicable test for determining if an individual is an employee or an independent contractor is the test set forth in the California Supreme Court decision in *S.G. Borello & Sons, Inc. v. Department of Industrial Relations* (1989) 48 Cal.3d 341 (*Borello*) or relevant statute.

In AB 2257, Section 2775 of Article 1.5 of Chapter 2 of Division 3 outlines the "ABC" test in paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) which provides a presumption of employment for a person providing labor or services for remuneration for purposes of the Labor Code, Unemployment Insurance Code, and the wage orders of the Industrial Welfare Commission. Under Section 2775, an individual is presumed to be an employee as opposed to an independent contractor unless an individual's hiring entity demonstrates that the conditions outlined in paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of Section 2775 are satisfied. Nothing in AB 2257 suggests that when a hiring entity demonstrates that the conditions in paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of Section 2775 are satisfied for the purposes of classifying an individual as an independent contractor, that the hiring entity must satisfy additional conditions outlined in Sections 2776 to Section 2784. It is still the intent of the author to preserve preexisting statutory extensions or exceptions to employment status which exist in the Labor Code, Unemployment Insurance Code, and the wage orders of the Industrial Welfare Commission.

AB 2257 addresses business-to-business contracting relationships. Specifically, Section 2776 provides that the holding in *Dynamex* and Section 2775 do not apply to a bona fide business-to-business contracting relationship if certain criteria are satisfied and, instead, the determination of employee or independent contractor status of the business services provider is governed by *Borello*. It is not the intent of the author to suggest that under this section, a business service provider must contract with more than one contracting business in order to satisfy the conditions under Section 2776. It is the intent of paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of Section 2776 to permit, if consistent with the nature of the work, the ability for a business service provider to be able to set their own hours, subject to reasonable project completion dates or reasonable business hours.

Section 2778 of AB 2257 defines an individual providing professional services for which the determination of classification as an employee or independent contractor is governed by *Borello* given certain criteria are satisfied, as opposed to the holding in *Dynamex* and Section 2775. This section references common occupational terms to be

understood as generally describing related and varied skills and services. This includes references to the terms “editor” and “copyeditor” which are intended to include services provided by an indexer and proofreader. Reference to the term “graphic design” is intended to include professional services involving the creation of pictures, images or other stylistic visual representations of concepts and ideas in various media and formats. Reference to the term “marketing” is intended to include professional services provided by promoters or communications specialists, given the work satisfies the conditions in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (2) in subdivision (b) of this section. Lastly, it is intended that the services provided by individuals outlined in subparagraph (K) of paragraph (2) in subdivision (b) will apply with respect to the listed types of publications or works “in any format or media,” not only to their print versions. Additionally, Section 2782 defines the term “data aggregator”, which is intended to be inclusive of an entity that requests and gathers feedback either directly or for the benefit of third parties.

Finally, the version of AB 2257 amended on August 25, 2020 has language in Section 3 of Article 1.5 of the bill that fails to capture the intent of the author due to a drafting error in the amendment to Section 17020.12 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. The language as of August 25, 2020 is not accurate and should instead read: “For the purposes of this part, except as otherwise provided, the determination of whether an individual is an employee shall be governed by Article 1.5 of Chapter 2 of Division 3 of the Labor Code.”

Dear Ms. Parker: The purpose of this letter is to express my intent in enacting AB 2699, which exempts specified entities from the prohibition against the sale or purchase of an “unsafe” handgun. This bill additionally places new safeguards to assure that these handguns do not get into the private market. It is this bill’s intent that the new penalties outlined in Penal Code Section 32000(a) (2) and (3) are specifically intended to apply to those who are subject to the exemptions outlined in Penal Code Section 32000(b) (4), (6) and (7).

Thank you for the opportunity to state the intent of this provision of AB 2699.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bills Nos. 831 and 168

Dear Ms. Parker: The undersigned legislators write to clarify the intent of AB 831 (Grayson) and AB 168 (Aguiar-Curry), based on clerical errors in the final version of the bills. AB 831 makes important technical clarifications to SB 35 (Wiener, Chapter 366, Statutes of 2017), the law related to housing projects that may be approved under a streamlined and ministerial process in certain jurisdictions that have not met their housing obligations. AB 168 requires a pre-consultation process with a California Native American tribe prior to the submission of an SB 35 (Wiener, Chapter 366, Statutes of 2017) permit application.

A clerical error in double-jointing amendments caused both bills to include incorrect paragraph references. We intend to correct these errors in the 2021 Legislative Session. The corrections in AB 831 are in section 1.5 of the bill: Subdivision (g) incorrectly cross references subdivision (b) in (l)(A), (l)(C), and (l)(D); each reference should be to subdivision (c). Subparagraph (D) within subdivision (g) incorrectly cross references subdivision (j), as that has now moved down to subdivision (l). The corrections in AB 168 are in Section 3.5 of the bill: Subdivision (g) incorrectly cross references subdivision (b) in (l)(A), (l)(C), and (l)(D); each reference should be to subdivision (c). Subparagraph (D) within subdivision (g) incorrectly cross references subdivision (j), as that has now moved down to subdivision (l).

This letter is intended only as a clarification of the legislature's intent in chaptering of AB 831 and AB 168, and intention to address clerical errors in chaptering amendments thereto. This letter is not offering a clarification of the policy content of either AB 831 or AB 168.

RE: AB 685 (Reyes)—COVID-19 Workplace Exposure Reporting & Notification

Dear Chief Clerk: My Assembly Bill 685 seeks to require employers to report COVID-19 exposures at the workplace to workers, their exclusive representative, if any, and the local health department. I would like to clarify my intentions, relating to the changes proposed by AB 685 to section 6409.6 (h) of the Labor Code.

AB 685 proposes to add Section 6409.6 (h) to the Labor Code that would exempt from subdivision (b) of the bill any “health facility,” as defined in Section 1250 of the Health and Safety Code. It is my intention to exempt from that reporting subdivision of the bill additional health facilities and licensed care facilities that are defined elsewhere but that are also already required to report workplace COVID-19 exposures and cases to the state Department of Public Health, or local health departments pursuant to state or federal law.

Accordingly, I wish to clarify my intention of AB 685.
