Dear Ms. Parker: The purpose of this letter is to express my intent as the author of Assembly Bill 1780, which prohibits independent institutions of higher education that benefit from state-funded student financial assistance or that enroll students who receive state-funded student financial assistance from providing any manner of legacy preference or donor preference in admissions to an applicant.

The bill establishes that these institutions shall not provide these preferences beginning September 1, 2025, and it was drafted to align the requirement with the timeline of academic year (AY) calendars. Furthermore, the bill requires that institutions provide annual reports to the Legislature and Department of Justice to attest to their compliance with, or violation of, the law. The annual deadline for that report is June 30.

It is my legislative intent, for purposes of the June 30, 2026 reporting deadline, that institutions that have updated their policies to comply with subdivision (c) of Education Code Section 66018.4 are deemed to meet the compliance standard referenced in subdivision (d)(1).

Due to the nature of college application cycles, institutions that have complied with subdivision (c) could also have newly enrolled students for AY2025–26 who were admitted under previous admissions policies. The intent of the reporting language in subdivision (d)(2) is to capture information for institutions that choose to violate the prohibition as outlined in AB 1780. It is not the intent of this bill to require institutions that are in compliance with the law effective September 1, 2025 to have to report on students admitted and/or enrolled under different policies prior to the effective date of implementation.

Dear Ms. Parker: As the author of Assembly Bill 2348, I want to clarify the intent of the changes being made to the *California Emergency Act* (§8594.13) related to the Feather Alert notification system.

AB 2348 supplements AB 1863 with technical changes to the notification mechanisms of the California Emergency Services Act to improve the underreporting of missing tribal citizens by making the feather alert system workable for Tribes of California. AB 1863 contains provisions that would allow tribal governments to submit requests to activate a feather alert directly to the California Highway Patrol (CHP) when tribes determine a tribal citizen is missing. It was brought to my attention that AB 1863, if incorrectly construed, could be used to create a barrier for tribal governments requesting an activation instead of facilitating the necessary haste of such requests during an emergency.

It is my intent that direct contact between tribes and CHP supplement, not negate, the need for direct communications and engagement between a tribe and a local law enforcement agency when reporting a missing person. While that initial contact with the local law enforcement agency is critically important during an emergency, it need not be any more complicated than a 911 call from an appropriate reporter. Regardless of the method of initial contact, AB 2348 affirms tribal governments' authority to submit requests to activate a feather alert directly to the CHP upon specified requirements being satisfied.

This bill aims to improve the underreporting of missing tribal citizens and to continue providing support to local law enforcement in addressing this systemic issue. The intent of the mentioned provision is to ensure that local law enforcement is directly engaged during active Feather Alerts.

It is not my intent that AB 1949 interfere with such transactions.

While I have reached agreement on clarifying language to resolve these issues, the legislative deadline prevents me from amending AB 1949 again this year. I am committed to working on follow-up legislation to address the abovementioned concerns should this measure be signed into law.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 2839

Dear Ms. Parker: I am writing to clarify my intent, as the author of AB 2839.

The purpose of AB 2839 is to prevent voters from being deceived into believing that fake images, audio or video, generated with an intent to deceive, are authentic recordings of candidates, election officials or election-related events. This new law is necessary because recent advancements in artificial intelligence technologies permit low-cost hyper-realistic content to be generated at an unprecedented scale.

AB 2839 is not intended to alter the well-established balance between free speech on the one hand, and the need to protect individuals or candidates from fraudulent and defamatory content on the other, in situations where a reasonable viewer would understand that the content is not a true recording of a person or event. In other words, this bill does not address a parodic or satiric video that is not materially deceptive, meaning a video that a reasonable viewer would understand from its content or context to not be a true recording of the person or event depicted in the video. Our longstanding legal and constitutional frameworks already fully address liability (and countervailing free speech protections) for content containing factual assertions or information about matters of public interest with which some may disagree.

Accordingly, the definition of "materially deceptive content" is intended to mean audio or visual media that is digitally created or modified with the intent that the media would falsely appear to a reasonable person to be an authentic record of the person or event depicted in the media. Where a reasonable person would understand that the media is fake or a dramatization, it should not constitute "materially deceptive content" for purposes of AB 2839 even if events depicted within the media are asserted to be inaccurate.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 3048

August 31, 2024

Dear Ms. Parker: I am writing to state my intent as the author of AB 3048, which requires browsers and, pursuant to regulation, mobile operating systems, to support opt-out preference signals (OOPS). Specifically, I seek to emphasize my intent with respect to privacy-by-design technologies. As made clear in the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) regulations and supporting documentation, selection of privacy-by-design products or services is an affirmative step and sufficient to express the consumer's intent to opt-out of the sale and sharing of personal information.

The CCPA requires businesses to honor opt-out preference signals as an opt-out of sale and sharing of their personal information. It directs the California Privacy Protection Agency (CPPA) to issue regulations to define the requirements and specifications for opt-out preference signals. Per the CCPA, the regulations should "clearly represent a consumer's intent and be free of defaults constraining or presupposing such intent[.]" Importantly, this provision is guidance to the CPPA in issuing regulations, not an obligation on businesses, and the CPPA has

since adopted conforming regulations.

Specifically, the CCPA regulations set forth the specifications of an opt-out preference signal that businesses must honor as an opt-out of sale and sharing of their personal information. An opt-out preference signal must be in a format commonly used and recognized by businesses. For browsers, such formats exist, such as an HTTP header field or JavaScript object. Since no such commonly used and recognized format exists for mobile operating systems, the CPPA is urged to work collaboratively with the mobile operating system industry on the development of such formats. In addition, the platform, technology, or mechanism that sends the signal must make clear to the consumer, either in its configuration or disclosures to the public, that the signal is meant to have the effect of opting the consumer out of the sale and sharing of their personal information.³

The supporting documentation for the original California Consumer Privacy Act regulations, issued by the Attorney General in 2020, made clear that a "consumer exercises their choice to enable opt-out preference signals by affirmatively choosing the privacy control, including when utilizing privacy-by-design products or services." Similarly, the supporting documentation for the California Privacy Protection Agency's CCPA regulations, finalized in 2023, emphasizes that "selection of privacy-by-design products or services is an affirmative step and sufficient to express the consumer's intent to opt out of the sale and sharing of personal information. Additional steps are not necessary, even if this means that a consumer relies on a privacy-by-default opt-out mechanism that is built into a platform,

technology, or mechanism."5

This letter seeks to underscore that selection of privacy-by-design products or services is an affirmative step and sufficient to express the consumer's intent to opt-out of the sale and sharing of personal information, and therefore this bill is intended to support the already recognized principle that a privacy-by-design browser or mobile operating system *can* send an OOPS and not conflict with existing law or its implementing regulations.

Thank you for this opportunity to emphasize the intent of AB 3048.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 2927

August 30, 2024

Sue Parker Chief Clerk of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 319 Sacramento, California

Dear Ms. Parker: As the author of AB 2927, this letter is to express my intent regarding a specific provision contained in AB 2927 (McCarty), which was included in the measure and signed into law by the Governor on June 29, 2024.

AB 2927 included a provision which created a new Section 51225.32 of the Education Code, directing the Instructional Quality Commission to develop and recommend to the State Board of Education a curriculum guide and resources for the separate, stand-alone one-semester course on personal finance mandated in other provisions of the bill. That new section also appropriated \$300,000 from the State General Fund to the Commission for purposes of carrying out the above duties.

While AB 2927 was being enacted, another piece of legislation, SB 153, was also being enacted which created a new Section 51225.32 of the Education Code, but addressed a completely different issue. While SB 153 was chaptered after AB 2927, I was informed by Legislative Counsel and the counsel of various agencies that since both provisions of the new enacted Section 51225.32 do not conflict or even address the same policy issues, that both versions of the new Section are concurrent in law.

It was my clear intent in authoring AB 2927 that the Instructional Quality Commission be assigned specific duties regarding curriculum and resource development related to personal finance courses and to appropriate funds to support this work. Given that AB 2927 did, in fact, include those provisions without conflicting with the provisions of the new Section 51225.32 created by SB 153, both provisions have taken effect and are current law.

I look forward to the Commission performing their duties under AB 2927 in a timely and efficient manner with the appropriation provided for in AB 2927 to support their efforts.

Thank you for allowing me to express the important intent embodied in AB 2927.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 518

August 31, 2024

Sue Parker Chief Clerk of the Assembly State Capitol, Room 319 Sacramento, California

Dear Ms. Parker: I write as the author of AB 518 to clarify the intent of the bill, with respect to the sharing of data amongst public entities for the purposes of increasing state CalFresh participation. AB 518 will require the State Department of Social Services (DSS) to work with stakeholders to develop a methodology for estimating the CalFresh participation rate and identifying characteristics of Californians who are eligible for, but not receiving, CalFresh benefits. To accomplish this, the bill authorizes DSS to identify data-sharing opportunities with other state and local public entities.

The intent of this bill is to facilitate federally allowable use of CalFresh data to improve program administration. This bill is not intended to exempt this sharing of data from all state privacy laws without addressing confidentiality, privacy, and security of consumer data. The Administration and the Legislature have made a commitment to work closely during the Fall to clarify limited and necessary exemptions from data sharing restrictions, to allow the disclosure of data for the narrow purposes of improving CalFresh program administration.

I am committed to the introduction of legislation at the beginning of the next session to address this issue. Further, as the implementation timeline included in AB 518 is tied to the current provisions of the bill, any future changes to the policy may also necessitate a delay.

It remains my intent for the State to carefully use data in a safe and tailored manner to inform strategies to maximize CalFresh food benefits and decrease the number of low-income individuals and families facing hunger.

Thank you for this opportunity to clarify the implementation of AB 518.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 98

Dear Ms. Parker: As the author of AB 98, I write to respectfully request the following letter be printed in the Assembly Daily Journal expressing my intent with respect to this measure.

In AB 98, the Legislature added Section 65098.6 of the Government Code to read as follows:

65098.6.

A city, county, or city and county shall condition approval of a logistics use on the following:

(a) Two-to-one replacement of any demolished housing unit that was occupied within the last 10 years, unless the housing unit was declared substandard by a building official, pursuant to Section 17920.3 of the Health and Safety Code, prior to purchase by the developer. For each housing unit demolished, regardless of market value of the unit, two units of affordable housing for persons and families of low or moderate income, as defined in Section 50093 of the Health and Safety Code, that are deed-restricted shall be built within the jurisdiction. Funds from any fee imposed for the replacement of demolished housing units shall be placed in a housing-specific set-aside account and shall be used for housing within three years of collection.

(b) If residential dwellings are affected through purchase, the developer shall be required to provide any displaced tenant with an amount equivalent to 12 months' rent at the current rate.

In adding Section 65098.6, we do not intend to limit the scope or application of Article 2 of Chapter 12 of Division 1 of Title 7 of the Government Code as that article applies to logistics uses.

Additionally, the term "logistics project", as used in AB 98, is intended to have the same meaning as a "logistics use" as defined in Government Code Section 65098.

Furthermore, it is the intent that the term "logistic use", as defined in 65098, means a building that is primarily used as a warehouse for the movement of cargo, goods, or products.
