To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 15 without my signature.

While I respect the author's intent to recognize the contributions of the Filipino people during World War II, State content standards and curriculum frameworks are necessarily broad, allowing for coverage of many important historical events and cultural developments. In fact, nothing in current law prohibits teachers today from recognizing the role of Filipinos in World War II.

Last year, I vetoed a nearly identical bill, AB 2512 (Horton, 2004), on the basis that current law already provides the necessary flexibility and that the State should refrain from being overly prescriptive. The veto message remains applicable and, thus, I am unable to sign this bill.

I am returning Assembly Bill 57 without my signature.

I firmly agree that workers must be properly compensated for public works through the payment of prevailing wages. In fact, California has some of the strongest prevailing wage protections in the nation. The existing law satisfactorily affords the appropriate balance between ensuring fair compensation for workers and flexibility for employers.

This bill would arbitrarily impose timelines on employers crediting pension and other benefits used in determining prevailing wages. In doing so, the balance afforded in current law would be weakened.

I am returning Assembly Bill 249 without my signature.

This legislation requires the Legislative Analyst's office to conduct a study regarding taxpayers' usage of the Form 540 2EZ. Last year I signed a bill which, among other substantive things, required the compilation of a report on the exact same tax form by the same entity.

This bill is unnecessary and partially duplicates the already required report. I strongly recommend that the Franchise Tax Board work with the authors and their analyst's office, the Legislative Analyst's office, to ensure that the report includes all of the desired information, including information regarding the eligibility expansion to those with capital gains. I believe that such expansion merits review.

Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 551

Governor's Office, Sacramento September 2, 2005

To Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 551 without my signature.

This bill requires duplicative reporting for agencies which provide referral services for domestic employees. Current law already provides sufficient reporting requirements to ensure that those who hire domestic workers are well aware of their obligations to pay taxes and procure workers' compensation insurance.

Assembly Bill 551 interferes with the marketplace by legislatively altering the requirements of one segment of the employment agency industry in order for another segment to gain competitive advantage without providing additional protections for domestic workers or those who hire them. This bill is unnecessary and inappropriately adds redundant requirements with no additional consumer protection.

For these reasons I cannot support this measure.
