MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

The following veto message from the Governor was received and ordered printed in the Journal and bill ordered to the unfinished business file:

Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 164

Governor's Office, Sacramento

September 2, 1999

To Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 164 without my signature.

This bill requires the Trustees of the California State University (CSU) and the governing board of each community college district to direct their respective campuses to make every effort to distribute a voter registration form annually to each newly admitted student, as specified. The measure would also require officials at each institution to make voter registration materials available at central campus locations. This measure requests the Regents of the University of California (UC) to adopt a similar policy.

While I support good faith efforts to distribute voter registration materials at our institutions of higher learning, I am opposed to imposing a state-mandated cost on the California community college districts. The 1999 Budget Act did not appropriate funding for these purposes, and I continue to believe that it is not necessary to provide funding for an activity that could easily be undertaken by campus groups or other civic groups.

In addition, the measure's five specified distribution methods would restrict the respective campuses' flexibility to utilize methods that would be more suitable to local circumstances.

RE: AB 811 (Keeley) Electrical restructuring—Power Exchange Energy Credit

Dear Mr. Wilson: As the author of Assembly Bill (AB) 811, I wish to clarify the issue of cost recovery by the utilities resulting from the implementation of procedures necessary to meet the requirements of the bill. AB 811 requires the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to specify an energy credit for customers with meters capable of recording data on an hourly basis to be based on the actual hourly data recorded by a customer meter and calculated as prescribed. As a result of this measure, affected utilities will be required to make programming changes in order to accommodate the movement from customer class load profile to the actual usage data of the customer in the determination of the energy credit.

During the debate on AB 811 in Senate Energy, Utilities and Communications Committee on July 13, 1999, testimony by the affected utilities revealed a wide disparity as to the cost of implementing these provisions. Cost ranges from \$250,000 to \$1 million were indicated by Pacific Gas and Electric, yet Southern California Edison testified that the cost would be de minimis. As a result, the discussion centered around a cost cap and what, if any, costs would be recoverable. Ultimately, the committee was reluctant to place a cap in the bill, anticipating that the affected utilities would seek to recover costs at the upper limit of any cap, regardless of the actual costs. Therefore, the committee resolved that any determination regarding the

reasonableness of such costs and their possible recovery should fall to the Commission and be examined under existing procedures used in reasonableness reviews by that body.

As such, to avoid confusion, I request that this explanation be printed in the Assembly Daily Journal in order to aid commission personnel, utility personnel, and ratepayers in understanding the intent of Assembly Bill 811.
