September 5, 2001

*To the Members of the California Legislature:*

I am signing Assembly Bill 4XX, which will make permanent a portion of the reporting requirements for anticipated electrical blackouts that I had included in Executive Order D-38-01, issued on June 5, 2001. However, this bill includes only a portion of the reporting requirements called for in the Executive Order, which requires notification to the State Office of Emergency Services, as well as to law enforcement.

I am therefore signing this bill with the understanding that the author will introduce cleanup legislation to make the notification requirements for blackouts consistent with the Executive Order.
