RE: Assembly Bill 575, Statement of Author's Intent,

AB 575 is the result of recent efforts to examine and institute reforms in the state's foster care system as it pertains to minors who appear before the juvenile court as a result of a petition under Welfare and Institutions Code sections 601 and 602. AB 575 is intended to bring California's delinquency statutes into compliance with Title IV E of the United States Social Security Act, and implement the requirements of the Adoption and Safe Families Act.

The Legislature directs the Judicial Council to adopt rules, forms and procedures that are consistent with the intent of AB 575, to promote reasonable efforts that preserve and reunify families, and where possible, ensure that all children grow up in safe permanent homes.

It is the intent of the Legislature that the Judicial Council monitor the provisions of AB 575 by maintaining data on the number of youth with juvenile court ordered permanent plans of return home, and the number

of orders for legal guardianship, alternative planned living arrangements, termination of parental rights, and adoption.

Re: AB 1511 Legislative Intent

Dear Mr. Wilson: I am writing to articulate the intent of Assembly Bill 1511 which is pending on the Senate Floor. AB 1511, sponsored by State Treasurer Philip Angelides, will protect the integrity of the municipal bond markets by reinforcing the geographic nexus requirement of the Marks-Roos Act.

AB 1511 is declaratory of existing law. Under *Government Code § 6500 et. seq.*, two or more public agencies must agree to form a Joint Powers Authority (JPA). AB 1511 would not alter this requirement. It would merely clarify that although a mutual water company may join in an already validly formed JPA consisting of at least two public agencies for the purpose of jointly exercising common powers, it cannot be considered a member of the JPA for purposes of satisfying the geographic nexus requirements of *Government Code § 6586.5*.

Under current law, a project to be funded by a JPA must be located within the jurisdiction of at least one of the constituent public agencies. Despite the fact that the definition of a “public agency” for purposes of the JPA law does not include a mutual water company, some recent financing transactions have been premised on the notion that a mutual water company can satisfy this geographic nexus requirement. AB 1511 is intended to end this latest effort to mislead investors about legality of “roving JPAs” and the appropriate uses of mutual water companies.

A concern was raised that piano teachers and those who provide similar services would inadvertently be brought within the scope of this bill. It is my intent that the language of Section 1701 (a)(1) of the Labor Code apply only to those persons offering services that are directly related to the future employment of the artist as an artist.

Those persons offering employment counseling or services in exchange for a fee unrelated to future employment should not be considered within the scope of this bill.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The purpose of this letter is to clarify my intent as the author of Assembly Bill 1584 with regard to certain provisions contained in the bill.

Article 8 of this measure creates the Yuba Feather Flood Protection Program. It is my intention that this article serves to provide funding necessary to assist state and local entities with the costs associated with flood protection projects in the region. Section 76068.8 (c) requires that local project proponents agree to pay at least that portion of the nonfederal capital costs required by Government Code Section 12585.5. This provision is not intended to require a mandatory local share where a local agency may be subject to the "ability to pay" provisions under subdivision (m) of Section 103 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 (33 U.S. C. 2213 (m)).

Furthermore, Section 79068.12 is intended to provide local share money for projects in Sutter County and implemented by the County of Sutter.

Dear Mr. Dotson: I respectfully request that the following letter be printed in the Assembly Daily Journal:

“To the Members of the Assembly and Senate:

I am the author of AB 1584, which provides for an Interim Reliable Water Supply and Water Quality Infrastructure and Management Program, Article 4 (commencing with Section 79205.2) of Chapter 9 of Division 26.

The intent of Article 4 is to respond to the critical water needs of California. In the event of a drought or other environmental circumstance, which leads to a substantial curtailment of California’s water supplies, the funds provided by Article 4 are designed to provide improved water reliability and quality for our state’s water supply.

It is my intent and the intent of Senator Jim Costa, that individual projects funded under Article 4 shall be reviewed on a project-by-project basis as part of the budget process. Further, these projects shall be recommended by the Department of Water Resources, with final approval being granted by the Governor.

It is not, however, the intent of Article 4 that any of the funds be used to construct surface water storage facilities or to extend the San Luis Drain.

Dear Mr. Wilson: The following is to clarify the intent of AB 1685, authored by the Assembly Committee on Information Technology, regarding the implementation of the statute proposed by this measure, should it be adopted into law.

The bill proposes to establish a process for placing notices of proposed changes to local regulated substance rules and regulations on the Internet. This measure provides that, should a city or county submit

such a notice to the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal-EPA), the Agency then place that notice on the Internet.

It is not the intent of the Committee to require Cal-EPA to post the exact notice sent by local regulating bodies on the Internet, but rather to require complete posting of the information contained therein. Further, it is the intent of the Committee that Cal-EPA determine how the information is to be posted best on the Internet. Moreover, it would not be inconsistent with the intent of the Committee to assume that Cal-EPA has the flexibility, within the requirements of this measure, to allow for uniform posting of information regardless of the form in which it was submitted to the Agency.

Dear Mr. Wilson: As author of Assembly Bill 1652, I wish to clarify the meaning of Section 4 of the bill.

Section 4 of the bill, as passed by the Senate on September 9, 1999, contains a new Section 226.7 of the Labor Code, prohibiting any employer from requiring any employee to work any meal or rest period mandated by an applicable order of the Industrial Welfare Commission.

This new section does not repeal any existing exceptions or waivers to meal or rest period requirements that are contained in any order, such as those which permit work during meal periods when the nature of the work prevents an employee from being relieved of all duty pursuant to a written agreement between the parties.

Dear Mr. Wilson: This letter is to clarify the intent of my bill, AB 604, relating to nonpoint source (NPS) pollution, and my expectations for the state Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) in this endeavor.

While AB 604 requires the SWRCB to consult with other state agencies to establish a program strategy and implementation plan and performance goals for management measures for NSP pollution in compliance with federal law by certain dates, I understand that the SWRCB does not have the statutory authority to mandate the policy or allocation of resources for the 22 other state agencies with NPS responsibilities. Therefore, the word “it” on page 3, line 37, and on page 4, line 7, refers solely to the status of the SWRCB’s NPS program elements, and I understand that this section does not give any additional authority to the SWRCB.

In addition, federal decisions of the state’s NPS Fifteen-Year Program Strategy and Five-Year Implementation Plan, by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, is expected in the spring of 2000. Since meeting the deadlines in the bill for establishing the performance goals and reporting to the Legislature on the management measures under development may be difficult to achieve by the dates specified, the bill calls on the SWRCB to notify the appropriate legislative policy and fiscal committees if these mandates cannot be completed nine months prior to the deadlines.

RE: Letter to the File AB 1154 (Torlakson)

Mr. Wilson: I am writing this letter to the file to clarify my intent in the meaning of Section 5, subdivision (a) of AB 1154. Specifically, this section reads:

“It is the intent of the Legislature that a minimum of eighty-five million dollars (\$85,000,000) be appropriated for the program established pursuant to this article, through the annual Budget Act. Of the funds appropriated for the program, 50 percent shall be reserved for programs that operate at elementary

schools and 50 percent shall be reserved for programs that operate at middle and junior high schools.”

I did not intend for this to conflict with the language in the Budget Act of 1999. The Budget Act appropriates an additional \$35 million to the After School and Safe Neighborhoods Program—\$25 million for middle school programs and \$10 million for the elementary school program. Therefore, it is my intent that AB 1154 complies with the Budget Act for the appropriation of funds for this program. I would be happy to introduce follow up legislation next year to clarify this intent.

Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 214

RE: AB 214 (Wiggins)

In introducing AB 214, it was my intent to encourage the use on public works projects of 1) unmanufactured materials that have been produced in the United States (preferably in California), and 2) manufactured materials that have been manufactured in the United States (preferably in California) from materials that are substantially derived from the United States (and preferably from California). This will channel taxpayer dollars collected from Californians to support jobs in California and in the United States rather than to export those jobs to other countries.

Thus, it was not my intent for this bill to deny a preference to materials where a substantial part of the *labor* involved in the production of the materials occurs in the United States or California. For example, if imported steel is re-rolled in California and the re-rolled steel is subsequently fabricated in California for use on a public works project, it would qualify for the preference. That is because the re-rolled steel that is subsequently fabricated is “substantially derived” from labor performed here in California. It was not my intent that there be a requirement in this bill that *all* the labor involved in creating the steel to be fabricated be performed in California or that the raw materials come from California. Rather, because the final “manufactured material” is the *fabricated* steel (not the unfabricated steel), it is enough that prior to fabrication a “substantial” amount of the labor necessary to create the steel which is subsequently fabricated (i.e. the material to be “manufactured”) is performed in California.

It is my belief that the language in this bill reflects my intent as outlined in this letter.
