PRAYER

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Mullin, the following prayer was offered by Assembly Alternate Chaplain Rev. Patti Oshita:

Please join me in a moment of reflection.

Already we feel a change in the weather. In a few weeks, many leaves will begin turning brilliant red and golden yellow. This begins my favorite time of year. When autumn arrives, I think again about one of my favorite haiku poems. As some may know, a haiku is considered the shortest form of structured poetry and is composed of only 17 syllables.

One of my favorite haiku was written by the monk and poet, Ryokan. Ryokan lived about 250 years ago in Niigata, Japan. In a true haiku, there is no feeling that a person is speaking. Instead, if it is done well, it becomes a pure description on the nature of things, just as they are; and within a true haiku, there is much left to the imagination. Ryokan's famous autumn haiku of 17 syllables reads:

"Ura o mise, omote o misete, chiru momiji."

"Showing back, showing front, maple leaves fall."

If we picture this haiku, we can see the seasons changing, moving away from the warmth of summer and into autumn. We might imagine a light breeze rippling through the trees, and the maple leaves, in fall colors, floating gently to the ground. Ryokan's haiku of maple leaves falling, reminds us that nothing can last forever. Understanding this reality of life is the seed of wisdom, and also the seed of gratitude.

Like the trees having to let go of their leaves, and the leaves having to fall from the trees, we know that in living through the seasons of life, we must all, if we are fortunate to live long, have to let go of people we love. And in time, we too, must let go of life itself. Always we wish it did not have to be so. But this is all a part of the natural cycle of life.

When the leaves begin their fall display, remember Ryokan's simple poem. It is his reminder to live—appreciating every autumn we are able to enjoy—in harmony with the natural oneness of life.
