Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the Department of Corrections' (department) contracting practices for private community correctional facilities (CCFs) and inmate population forecasting.

This report concludes that in processing a no-bid CCF contract that was ultimately rescinded, certain contacts made by two of the contractor's employees who formerly worked for the department may have violated conflict-of-interest laws, and the department does not ensure that its retired annuitants in designated positions file statements of economic interests. Nonetheless, information the department relied upon to determine the need for two no-bid CCF contracts appears accurate. Additionally, the department's inmate population projections are useful for budgeting, but have limited value for longer-range planning, such as determining when to build additional facilities.

Finally, because certain practices increase the subjectivity of the department's projections and no documentation of the projection process exists, our statistical expert could not establish the validity of the projection process.
