Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the California State Auditor presents this audit report concerning the rate-setting policies and oversight related to the in-home respite services program (in-home respite services) administered by the Department of Developmental Services (DDS). Californians with developmental disabilities can access services through the State's network of 21 regional centers, which receive funding and oversight from DDS.

This report concludes that DDS has chosen not to obtain and review information that could assist it in determining whether its hourly payment rates to vendors for providing in-home respite services are appropriate. Specifically, because of its interpretation of certain changes in state law that took effect in 1998 and 2003, DDS has since changed its approach to calculating payment rates and no longer requires vendors to submit cost statements, which detail vendors' expenses. Rather, DDS currently adjusts the hourly vendor rates based on legislatively approved rate adjustments and changes to minimum wage or labor laws. However, we question DDS's interpretation of these statutes as negating

the need for cost statements, and we believe clarifying legislation is needed because DDS could have been assessing the appropriateness of payment rates based on vendors' cost statements since 2003.

Further, during the past few years, we found that the statewide weighted average hourly payment rate under what we refer to as the Full Service model, in which the vendor recruits the respite worker and schedules services, increased from \$17.76 to \$21.21, or by more than 19 percent, while the respite workers' hourly wage increased from \$9.89 to \$11.14, or by roughly 13 percent. We also found that, unlike certain other services provided by DDS, in-home respite services is not subject to an administrative cost cap of 15 percent. Therefore, the four vendors that received over \$7 million in revenue for providing in-home respite services in fiscal year 2014–15 reported a wide variance in terms of their administrative costs. Specifically, the amounts the four vendors reported spending on administrative costs ranged from 12 percent to nearly 30 percent. Without a cap on administrative costs, the State runs the risk that vendors are spending unreasonable amounts on these types of costs.

Finally, for in-home respite services, we identified that regional centers perform minimal monitoring of vendors and that DDS performs limited oversight of the regional centers. For instance, DDS is not ensuring that vendors comply with state and federal requirements and limits its review of the program to its biennial fiscal audits of the regional centers. However, these audits have not been conducted in a timely manner and may not include a review of in-home respite services at all because it is a smaller program in comparison to others administered by DDS.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the California State Auditor presents this audit report concerning the Los Angeles Unified School District's (LAUSD) policies and practices for removing teachers from the classroom in response to allegations of misconduct and for resolving those allegations.

This report concludes that LAUSD can do more to reduce the impacts of those teacher removals, known as *reassignments*. The costs of reassigning teachers, who generally continue to receive their regular salaries and benefits while reassigned, have declined at LAUSD in recent years. However, recent trends in LAUSD's resolution of reassignments suggest that case backlogs—and costs—could rise again in coming years. Specifically, LAUSD's data show that the district is

resolving fewer reassignments annually and taking longer to resolve the cases it does close. LAUSD often exceeded the time frames it has set for itself to investigate alleged misconduct and make disciplinary decisions, and it does not sufficiently monitor compliance with these time frames or evaluate how the district has performed over time. In cases where teachers have been reassigned for particularly long periods, LAUSD has taken months or even years to identify appropriate placements for some teachers after the district or administrative and legal hearings have determined the teachers should return to work.

Additionally, LAUSD can do more to ensure that its decisions to reassign teachers are necessary and that local administrators approach those decisions consistently. Although most of the reassignment cases we reviewed indicated a clear safety threat, we noted two instances in which local administrators reassigned teachers without demonstrating a clear safety threat. Improved training and guidance, and development of a comprehensive evaluation tool for local administrators to use when making reassignment decisions, will help ensure reassignments are necessary and consistent.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the California State Auditor presents this audit report concerning Los Angeles County's (county) oversight of the Los Angeles County Fair Association (association). The county has a lease with the association that allows the association to operate the Los Angeles County Fair and conduct other activities on land largely owned by the county. Under the terms of this lease, the association must pay rent to the county based on a percentage of the revenue the association receives from its activities on this land.

This report concludes that the county has exercised weak oversight of its lease with the association. In our audit, we found that although the association owns a hotel that operates on county-owned land, the county allowed the association to exclude its hotel's revenue from its rent calculation for reasons that the county cannot adequately explain. Consequently, the county likely relinquished more than \$6 million in rent revenue from 2006 through 2015.

In addition, we found that the association provides its executives with significantly higher compensation than the executives in charge of other large fairs in California receive. For instance, in 2014 the association's former president received over \$1 million in total compensation, and many members of the association's executive management team earn more than the chief executives in charge of the State's other large fairs.

However, as a nonprofit corporation that is not a public charity, the association is legally allowed to set its executive compensation at levels greater than those set by public entities. Finally, although the association received millions of dollars in public funding related to one of its recreational vehicle (RV) parks, the association failed to maintain the RV park, resulting in it being cited for numerous health and safety violations.

We recommend that to protect its interests and maximize its future revenue, the county should strongly consider ensuring that any potential amendment to the lease includes a revised rent calculation formula that factors in revenue from all of the association's activities, including revenue from its hotel.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the California State Auditor presents this audit report concerning the State's oversight of its apprenticeship programs, in particular, the Air Conditioning Trade Association (ACTA).

This report concludes that the State needs to better oversee apprenticeship programs such as ACTA. Although the Division of Apprenticeship Standards (apprenticeship division) of the Department of Industrial Relations has primary responsibility for overseeing apprenticeship programs, it has not been adequately performing its duties. For example, the apprenticeship division is not consistently conducting audits, as required by state law, and it is not using its audit authority to ensure that apprenticeship programs are spending state funds appropriately. Furthermore, inadequate oversight by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (Chancellor's Office) and the Central Unified School District (Central Unified)—the K–12 local educational agency that has the fiscal contract with ACTA—resulted in ACTA receiving an estimated \$51,000 in unallowable reimbursements in fiscal years 2010–11 through 2014–15. Finally, the U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. Labor) completed a civil investigation of ACTA in December 2014 and determined that between 2005 and 2012 ACTA misused \$800,000 in apprenticeship training funds. The apprenticeship division currently does not have a process in place to learn if the federal government has investigated certain apprenticeship programs.

We recommend that the apprenticeship division resume conducting program audits by December 2016. We also recommend that Central Unified work with the Chancellor's Office to determine how to best recover the unallowable amounts it reimbursed to ACTA. Finally, we recommend that the apprenticeship division periodically contact the U.S. Labor to inquire about recent investigations of apprenticeship programs and determine whether it should conduct its own audits to ensure apprenticeship programs are using state funds appropriately.

Members of the Assembly: As required by Chapter 31, Statutes of 2013, the California State Auditor presents this audit report assessing five superior courts' compliance with the requirements of the California Judicial Branch Contract Law (judicial contract law), Public Contract Code sections 19201 through 19210. The judicial contract law requires the Judicial Council of California to adopt and publish a *Judicial Branch Contracting Manual* (judicial contracting manual), which establishes the requirements for procurement and contracting that all judicial branch entities, including superior courts, must follow.

For the five courts we reviewed for this audit—the superior courts of Riverside, San Diego, San Joaquin, San Mateo, and Tehama counties—we found fewer instances of the courts not adhering to procurement processes compared to the superior courts reviewed in our past two procurement audits. The Riverside and San Diego courts consistently adhered to the required and recommended practices in the judicial contracting manual, while the other three courts had some shortcomings in following these guidelines. For example, the three courts did not always follow the recommended practice of determining if prices were fair and reasonable for noncompetitive contracts. In other cases, the San Joaquin, San Mateo, and Tehama courts did not document why they did not use a competitive process for some contracts. Finally, the San Joaquin and San Mateo courts did not consistently make sure that goods and services were received before issuing payments.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the California State Auditor presents this audit report concerning school library services. State law requires school districts to provide library services to their students and teachers, but leaves the level of services provided to the discretion of school districts. In 2010 the State Board of Education adopted the *Model School Library Standards for California Public Schools, Kindergarten Through Grade Twelve* (model standards), which define educational goals for students at each grade level, including goals for information literacy.

This report concludes that state law does not clearly define the minimum level of school library services school districts should provide. School districts can provide library services by employing teacher librarians, contracting for the provision of library services with county offices of education that employ teacher librarians, contracting with public libraries, which are not required to employ teacher librarians, or by limiting their provision of library services to certain types that do not require a teacher librarian. School districts in the counties we visited—Sacramento, San Bernardino, and Tulare—provide varying levels of library services to their students and teachers. One school district contracts with its county office of education, whereas the other two school districts employ teacher librarians, but place them only in the advanced grades. As a result, their students in lower grades receive fewer types of library services, and some may receive no more than access to library materials.

In addition, state and county agencies have little authority to monitor the provision of library services when performing their oversight responsibilities. Although the Commission on Teacher Credentialing and the county offices of education we visited do monitor staffing assignments to verify that school districts employ or have access to certificated teacher librarians, they do not have express authority to assess whether districts actually provide library services. In addition, state law does not require county offices of education to ensure that their school districts consider the model standards when developing their local funding plans. As a result, school districts may be unaware that the model standards are one of the State's academic content and performance standards, and thus they may fail to identify the needs of their school library programs.

California has by far the poorest ratio of students to teacher librarians in the nation. In fiscal year 2013–14, California employed one teacher librarian for every 8,091 students while at the same time the national average was 1,109 students per teacher librarian. Although state law does not require school districts to employ teacher librarians, the model standards recommend employing one full-time teacher librarian for every 785 students. Finally, the number of individuals with active

credentials authorizing them to provide library services has declined since fiscal year 2008–09. Thus, even schools that are interested in hiring teacher librarians may face difficulties in filling vacancies.
