INTRODUCTION OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 70—Wright. An act to add Article 5.7 (commencing with Section 8590) to Chapter 7 of Division 1 of Title 2 of the Government Code, relating to fire safety, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

PROCLAMATION

Proclaiming December 13, 2000 as Julian C. Dixon Remembrance Day

WHEREAS, Congressman Julian C. Dixon represented the 32nd Congressional District for 11 terms, served as a member of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Defense, the Subcommittee on Commerce, Justice, State and Judiciary; and the Subcommittee on the District of Colombia, and served as Ranking Member on the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, and as Chair of the Congressional Black Caucus; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Dixon's legislative career covered a broad range of subjects, including intelligence, defense, congressional ethics and federal management of the District of Colombia; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Dixon, a strong advocate of civil rights causes, worked to maintain the nation's commitment to civil rights, and to boost the economic standards of his district; and as a member of the House panels that oversee federal funding, felt a real responsibility to provide funding to schools, health care, police and fire departments; and

WHEREAS, the many accomplishments of Congressman Dixon included establishing a commuter rail system for Los Angeles, erecting a memorial to Martin Luther King Jr. in the nation's capital, providing emergency funding for damaged businesses after the 1992 civil disturbances in Los Angeles, and leading efforts to help his community after the 1994 Northridge earthquake; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Dixon, who passed away on December 8, 2000, was well loved and highly respected by his Congressional colleagues and the Californians he served for his lifetime of achievement and his work towards the advancement of his fellow man; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that I, Cruz M. Bustamante, Acting Governor of the State of California, do hereby declare Wednesday, December 13, 2000 as 'Julian C. Dixon Remembrance Day' in the State of California, and urge all Californians to join me in recognizing the numerous accomplishments of this dedicated public servant who has given so much to the people of the State of California and the people of our great nation.

PROCLAMATION

Proclaiming December 14, 2000 as Blood Donor Day

WHEREAS, the need for blood is ongoing and must be met every day; and California's blood banks are dangerously low in supply; and

WHEREAS, blood donors are needed throughout the year, but are most needed during the holidays, when the number of donations declines and the demand usually increases; and

WHEREAS, in past years during the holiday season, blood donations dropped to critically low levels throughout the state, resulting in the postponement of elective surgeries; and

WHEREAS, every day thousands of patients, including those being treated for accidents, surgeries and serious diseases such as cancer, heart diseases, sickle cell anemia and hemophilia, rely on the generosity of blood donors from the community to supply life-giving blood; and

WHEREAS, every two seconds, someone needs blood, and 95% of individuals who live beyond their 72nd birthday will need a blood transfusion at some point in their lives, yet fewer than 5% of individuals who are eligible donors actually donate blood; and

WHEREAS, blood cannot be stockpiled, as it has a shelf life of no more than 42 days, so new blood donors need to continuously be recruited to meet the needs of patients through the state; and

WHEREAS, because donating blood is a completely safe, relatively quick and easy life-saving act, all Californians who are 17 years of age or older, weight at least 110 pounds, are in good health and are not at risk for HIV/AIDS or other blood borne infectious diseases should be encouraged to donate this holiday season and throughout the year; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that I, Cruz M. Bustamante, Acting Governor of the State of California, do hereby declare Thursday, December 14th 2000, as Blood Donor Day in the State of California, and urge all Californians to joint me in recognizing the thousands of individuals who currently give blood and encourage others to consider donating blood in order to help ensure an adequate blood supply for our Great State.
